### IOC

On 13 December, IOC President Jacques Rogge chaired the discussions of the **Radio and Television Commission** meeting in Lausanne.

On 9 December the IOC decided to accept the Ethics Commission's recommendations concerning the case of **Mr Guy Drut** - to prolong the Ethics Commission's inquiry until 31 May 2006, in order to know the outcome of Mr Guy Drut's request for amnesty and, because of the existing conviction, to provisionally suspend, for the duration of the inquiry, all the rights, prerogatives and functions deriving from Mr Guy Drut's membership of the IOC. The Ethics Commission will take up the file again no later than at the end of the above period.

The Executive Board also accepted the Ethics Commission's recommendation not to apply provisional measures to **Mr Yong Sung Park**, seeing as there have been no measures of protection, nor any judicial decision taken by the Korean legal authorities concerning him. The Ethics Commission continues to deal with the case, and is closely following developments in the situation.

### \* NOCS

On 2 and 3 December, the **European Olympic Committees** (EOC) held its 34th General Assembly in Dublin (Ireland). The main issue on the agenda was the election of a new Executive Committee for the next four years. Reconfirmed in their posts were President Mario Pescante, Vice-President

Alexander Kozlovsky, and Secretary General Patrick J. Hickey. Thirteen members were elected including the Athletes' Representative (the list can be found at [www.eurolympic.org](http://www.eurolympic.org)). Furthermore, the 2005 EOC Order of Merit was awarded to IOC member Prince Albert II of Monaco.

At a meeting on 10 December in Cologne, the **German NOC and the German Sports Federation** (Deutscher Sportbund - DSB) agreed on the principle of merging the two organisations. The new body, which should be called the German Olympic Sports Federation (Deutscher Olympische Sportbund - DOSB), is set to start life on 20 May 2006 in Frankfurt, once the merger has been officially ratified by both parties. UIPM President Klaus Schormann was one of the main speakers in favour for the fusion of DSB and NOC.

### \* WOA

WOA hosted its third Executive Board meeting of the year in Beijing under the lead of its President Dr Pal Schmitt. Joël Bouzou attended as Treasurer. Amongst all items discussed at the Ex Board Meeting, the main important ones were the Visa Olympians Reunion Center in Torino and the WOA budget for 2006. The WOA Executive Board was hosted by BOCOG's President, Mr Liu Qi and by the President of the Chinese Olympic Committee, Mr Liu Peng. Right after the Executive Board meeting, a WOA Asia/Oceania Regional Seminar



was organised for 22 NOAs of these regions with the excellent support of BOCOG.



#### \* 2006 Turin

On 8 December, IOC President Jacques Rogge and Italian President Carlo Azeglio Ciampi, at a ceremony organised at the Palazzo Del Quirinale started the **Olympic Torch Relay** for the 2006 Games. After some brief speeches, President Ciampi lit the torch of the first runner, Stefano Baldini, Italian Olympic marathon champion in Athens, thus marking the beginning of the Relay through Italy to Turin, where Games will begin on 10 February 2006. UIPM Member for Development Timur Dossymbetov took part in the torch relay in Rome on 6 December.

The **medals** for the XX Olympic Winter Games in 2006 were unveiled by Jean-Claude Killy, Chairman of the IOC's Coordination Commission, and Valentino Castellani, President of TOROC. The medal is round with an empty space in the centre, representing the Italian piazza. You can view the medals at [www.torino2006.org](http://www.torino2006.org).

#### \* 2008 Beijing

On 6 December, the Organising Committee for Beijing 2008 (BOCOG) launched a global campaign to solicit design proposals for the **Olympic torch**. This campaign will end on 2 February 2006. More information can be found at [www.beijing2008.com](http://www.beijing2008.com).

#### \* 2012 London

On 19 December, Paul Deighton, Chief Operating Officer of Goldman Sachs' European businesses, was announced as new **Chief Executive Officer** for the London Olympic Games Organising Committee (LOCOG) Speaking publicly for the first time following his appointment, Deighton said: "As a Londoner passionate about sport, I am extremely excited about this opportunity. The Games has an enormous potential to inspire young people. The memories of the Games I listened to and watched in my childhood are some of the most inspirational memories I have. To help stage the Olympic Games and Paralympic Games, the world's most important sporting and cultural events, in my home city is a dream come true," said 49-year-old Deighton. Introducing Deighton to the media, London 2012 Chairman, Sebastian Coe said many highly qualified applicants were considered during the rigorous selection process. "We selected Paul because of his experience in leading large international organisations and projects and his

track record of managing and growing large teams of people in complex and diverse environments" he said. Deighton will handle the day-to-day running of LOCOG and will oversee programmes such as sponsorship, marketing, ticketing and the torch relay. The appointment ends a three-month search with more than 1,000 people expressing an interest and 300 going on to apply.

#### International Sport issues

The 5th edition of the **Jeux de la Francophonie** took place 7-17 December in Niamey (Niger). Almost 2,000 athletes representing 44 countries competed in six sports and seven cultural events. More information can be found at <http://jeux.francophonie.org>.

From 27 November to 5 December, the city of Manila (Philippines) hosted more than 5,000 athletes from 11 countries who came to participate in the **23rd South-East Asian Games**. Forty three sports were on the programme.

More than 1,200 athletes from 13 countries competed in 11 sports at the **3rd West Asian Games**, held 1-10 December in Doha (Qatar). More information can be found on the Olympic Council of Asia (OCA)'s web site [www.ocasias.org](http://www.ocasias.org).

#### \* WADA

The World Anti-Doping Agency in collaboration with the Karolinska Institute and the Swedish Sports Confederation, held a workshop meeting in Stockholm on the subject of gene doping in sport on 4-5 December 2005. The meeting included more than 50 participants from 15 countries and included geneticists and other biomedical scientists, ethicists, public policy experts, representatives of the International Olympic Committee, and the broad international sports community. The participants discussed the current scientific, ethical and public policy issues related to the possibility of gene transfer for the purpose of enhancing athletic performance and reached agreement on the several principles and conclusions. ## UIPM

### UIPM visit to Beijing

UIPM President Klaus Schormann, UIPM Secretary General Joël Bouzou and UIPM Vice President for Business Affairs, John Helmick visited Beijing at the beginning of this month for meetings with the Organising Committee of the 2008 Olympic Games (BOCOG) and the Chinese Modern Pentathlon Federation. Taking part in the visits from BOCOG were Executive Vice President Yang Shu'an and Division Chief for IF Relations Pan Zhiwei. From the Chinese MP Federation, Secretary General Zhang Bin and Vice President Haifeng Xu accompanied the UIPM delegation and also met with the UIPM President on 6 December to discuss the preparations of the Junior World Championships 2006 in Shanghai.

In Beijing, the UIPM officials were invited for a tour of the venues in construction. Discussions were held on training venues, test event, competition schedule, horses, ITOs and NTOs, seminars for judges, UIPM hotel and hospitality, ticketing, transportation. A review of Chinese horses was discussed and will be done in Spring both by BOCOG and UIPM experts.

Both UIPM and BOCOG were very happy of the progress made in the preparation of the 2008 Olympics.

President Klaus Schormann also met with IOC member Zhenliang He, Chairman of the Commission for Culture and Olympic Education for a working dinner to discuss the Commission's work and the next meeting in Beijing in October 2006.

### 2005 UIPM Congress

UIPM President Klaus Schormann welcomed delegates from all five continents to Rome from 16-17 December, for the annual UIPM Congress. The delegates were also received by Lucio Felicita, President of the Modern Pentathlon Federation of Italy.

President Klaus Schormann summarised for the Congress his political activities carried out on behalf of UIPM throughout the year, including the all important IOC session in Singapore where Modern Pentathlon was confirmed as included on the programme of the 2012 Olympic Games in London. The President also reported on the continued cooperation with UIPM's partners in the Olympic Family and world sporting movement, in particular, participation at SportAccord and at Conferences staged by various IOC Commissions.

All the UIPM Vice President's gave presentations to the Congress on the respective areas - Juan Antonio Samaranch Jr, Kui Sung Choi, John Helmick and Ivar Sisniega.

Secretary General Joël Bouzou presented the Olympic Qualification system for the Beijing 2008 Games that had been put to the IOC Executive Board for decision, the latest calendars for 2007 and 2008, presentations on the World Swim for Malaria and the World School Biathlon projects.

Reports and presentations were received from Treasurer Gyula Bretz, the EB Members for Sport (Mauro Tirinnanzi), Development (Timur Dossymbetov), Marketing (Martin Dawe), Media (Pernille Svarre), Athletes' (Stefano Giommoni) and the UIPM Honorary Auditors. Medical Committee Chair Fabio Pigozzi gave a report on 2005 and also demonstrated the ADAMS system to the Federations with athletes in the 2006 UIPM Registered Testing Pool. The Continental Confederations presented their year's activities and their proposals for the coming years.

The main achievement of the Congress was the approval of the International Calendar and Budget for next year, which will include a stronger support to World Cup organisers, approval of two technical motions and one medical motion for rule changes and the award of the UIPM Medal of Honour to Sandor



Kerekes. Sandor had been awarded in the past with the UIPMB Honorary Medals for his excellent work during the 1976 Olympic Games in Montreal and the preparations for the Games including the organisation of the Junior World Championships in 1975. Very recently, however, his UIPMB award was stolen. Sandor has been working for more than 20 years for Modern Pentathlon in Canada, and was one of the founding members of the national federation in that country. The UIPM Medal of Honour was awarded in recognition of his continuing commitment and involvement in our sport.

### UIPM Executive Board

The EB met on 15 December in Rome. President Klaus Schormann and Secretary General Joel Bouzou led the meeting which focused on preparation of the Congress and overall review of the goals set for the coming years. ### Nations

#### \* Hungary

The Hungarian public and the sport journalists elect every year the Athletes of the Year. In 2005 at both elections Zsuzsanna Vörös was voted Woman Athlete of the Year. The Hungarian Male MP Team came in 4th in the classification of teams. UIPM sends its congratulations to Zsuzsa and the members of the men's team for their success.

#### \* Ireland

2005 has been a great year of development for the Modern Pentathlon Association of Ireland (MPAI). A significant milestone was achieved when the Olympic Council of Ireland (OCI) provided initial funding in February. The first full AGM was held in March, in conjunction with a development tetrathlon competition, where a Board of Management and the constitution formally adopted.

Following the first representation of Ireland at youth international level in April, fencing and shooting training days were established, making use of equipment purchased through the OCI funding. Many new athletes were introduced to the sport and a team of 17 youth athletes travelled to Portugal in July, the first ever squad of youth pentathletes to represent Ireland and our sincere thanks to the Portuguese Federation for hosting them. MPAI was also once again represented at the Junior European and the Junior World Championships.

The year drew to a close on a high note with the staging of the first ever Irish Modern Pentathlon Championships. 74 athletes took part in the inaugural event in Dublin, from Youth E up to Masters. It was a very successful weekend, and in combination with promotional events and TV publicity, it provided a great boost for MP development in Ireland.

Goals for 2006 include plans to send more youth squads to training camps in Europe, and to bring expert coaches to Ireland to help with development. MPAI is planning a number of competitions for 2006 with the ultimate goal of hosting a continental youth championship within 3 years.

#### Continental Confederations

##### NORCECA Championships

**Niul Manske** (USA) placed first in the men's competition at the Open NORCECA Championships on 3-4 December in Guatemala City, Guatemala, leading the United States to a team gold medal. Manske finished with a total score of 5344, edging team mate **Sam Saksen**, who ended the competition in second with 5340 points. 2005 Pan American Champion Eli Bremer (USA) won the swim portion in a time of 2:02 and placed fourth overall with a score of 5308, missing the medal stand by just eight points as Bronze medal went to Panama's top athlete **Jose Guitian**.

On the women's side, the Open Invitational event winner was the 2005 South American Champion from Brazil, **Jane Marquez**, with 5164 points; but she only just managed to hold off 2005 Pan American Bronze medallist **Katia Rodriguez** (CUB) who finished a second behind for a total 5160 points, taking the title 2005 NORCECA Champion. US National Champion, **Michelle "Mickie" Kelly**, finished first in the run and placed second overall in the NORCECA Championships with 5052 points.
