IOC

The IOC Sport and Environment Commission held their annual meeting in Lausanne at the beginning of the month and announced that the **7th World Conference on Sport and Environment** will be held in Beijing in the second half of 2007. The Commission reviewed the implementation of the recommendations made at the 5th and 6th World Conferences on Sport and Environment, debriefed reports from Olympic organizing committees of Turin, Beijing, Vancouver and London on their work, and recommended that the newly published IOC Guide to Sport, Environment and Sustainable Development be widely publicized and carried out.

In Vancouver, Canada, the IOC organised the official debrief of the Turin Olympic Winter Games. Entitled "**The Turin 2006 Olympic Experience**", this five-day event, gave the opportunity to the Organising Committees of Vancouver 2010, Beijing 2008 and London 2012, as well as the three Candidate Cities for 2014, to learn from the experiences of Turin 2006. A great deal of good quality knowledge was transferred, the Turin organisers having explained openly their operations of last February. The participants also heard the testimonies of several key groups, such as the athletes, spectators, volunteers, International Federations, National Olympic Committees and

partners, among others, and were thus able to understand not only the point of view of the organisers, but also that of the various parties concerned.



International Sport issues

* GAISF/ASOIF

The President of IBAF, Aldo Notari, passed away on 25 July at the age of 73, as a result of a serious illness. A former baseball player, Mr Notari was first elected IBAF President in 1993 and subsequently re-elected 3 times (in 1997, 2001 and 2005). From 1985 to 2005, he was also President of the European Baseball Confederation. Besides being IBAF President, Mr Notari was a member of the Council of the Association of Summer Olympic International Federations (ASOIF). UIPM extends its deepest sympathy to his family and friends and all his colleagues in the world of baseball.

* SPORT FOR ALL

The 11th World Sport for All Congress will take place at the International Conference Centre in Havana, Cuba from 31 October - 3 November 2006. Organised by the Cuban National Olympic Committee under the patronage of the IOC and in co-operation with GAISF and the World Health Organisation, the main theme the 11th World Sport for All Congress is "Physical activity: benefits and challenges".

The various sub-themes discussed are:

- Sport for All as a recreation and as a form of social experience and cultural expression
- Meeting developing countries' specific needs in Sport for All
- Health benefits and risks of physical activity / Sport for All programmes
- Modern ageing and specific population groups (people with a disability, people living in poverty, etc.): a challenge for Sport for All
- Designing strategies and directions for Sport for All.

A delegation from **UIPM**, comprising President Klaus Schormann, Secretary General Joël Bouzou, Vice President Ivar Sisniega and NORCECA Confederation President John Holland, will be attending the Congress. The UIPM Secretary General will also make a presentation to the Congress at one of the plenary sessions on "Biathlon and Mass Participation".

* SPORTACCORD 2007

The 5th International Sports Convention, SportAccord 2007, will take place in Beijing, China, 23-27 April 2007. SportAccord is a once-a-year unique opportunity for the commercial sector to meet with the sports movement, bidding cities and organising committees, alongside commercial partners, sponsors, architects, sports lawyers, broadcasters and other specialists. The convention program includes open conference sessions, workshops, seminars, networking opportunities and a major exhibition, all scheduled around the Associations' institutional and executive meetings of GAISF, ASOIF, AIOWF, ARISF, IWGA, IMGA and the IOC.

* WADA

Richard Pound, president of the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) welcomed IOC President Jacques Rogge to the Agency's headquarters on 18 July. On his second official visit to WADA since its establishment in Montreal in 2002, Dr. Rogge met with WADA management and discussed the

Agency's progress in leading the global fight against doping in sport.

WADA Director General David Howman and key staff presented to Dr. Rogge a review of important milestones in WADA's activities and highlighted current initiatives for continuing progress. Among priorities discussed were the commitment to scientific research for the detection of emerging doping substances and methods, the fostering of anti-doping programs in regions of the world where there exists limited or no anti-doping activities, the development of effective strategies for athlete and athlete entourage anti-doping education, and the importance of stakeholder implementation of strong no-advance-notice out-of-competition testing.

UIPM meets with CISM

President Klaus Schormann and Sports Director Mauro Tirinnanzi were in Brussels on 5th July to meet with the representatives of CISM.

"We met Colonel Michel van Meurs Secretary General CISM, Colonel Alexandre Morisod Director General Affairs, and LT Celso Da Silva CISM Sport Commission Secretary. The CISM General Secretary is a former pentathlete from the Netherlands.

The meeting was very friendly. UIPM recognised CISM's historical role, one of the milestones of the Modern Pentathlon organisation. Discussions took place about the synergies to promote Modern Pentathlon especially in new countries and to improve future collaborations between UIPM and CISM on seminars, training centres, etc."

UIPM President's Activities

President Klaus Schormann met with Executive Board member of the Oetker AG group, Dr. Dr. hc Guido Sandler, on 3 July in Frankfurt to discuss sport business and anti-doping activities.

On 7 July, the UIPM President met with Rudi Trost in Berlin to discuss the preparations for the Senior World Championships in Guatemala in November, including technical matters, facilities, transportation. Rudi Trost is now in Guatemala City until 4 August.

On 8 July, President Klaus Schormann was a guest at a dinner hosted by IOC Vice President and DOSB President Thomas Bach for all the IOC members who were in Berlin for the final match of the 2006 FIFA World Cup.



UIPM President celebrates 60th Birthday

On the occasion of his 60th birthday celebrations on 17 July, President Klaus Schormann welcomed amongst his guests IOC Vice President and DOSB President Thomas Bach, who offered greetings on behalf of the German sports society and offered greetings also from IOC President Jacques Rogge on behalf of the Olympic Movement.

The UIPM/DVMF President also celebrated on this day his 46th anniversary as an elected volunteer in a sports function. His first position was obtained at the age of 14 years, in 1960, in parallel with his athletic career (1952-1976).

UIPM congratulates its President for both achievements on behalf of the Modern Pentathlon family.

UIPM Secretary General Joël Bouzou met with the French Minister of Sport Jean Francois Lamour in Paris on the evening of 18 July.

UIPM mourns Honorary Member George Wilson

UIPM regrets to inform the Modern Pentathlon family that UIPM Honorary Member George Merrill Wilson died on 3 July at the age of 95 years.

George Wilson spent 34 years developing and managing sports programs for the US Army and Department of Defense from 1946 to 1980. He began his federal career when the War Department recruited him in 1946 to develop new sports programs for the occupation forces in Europe. After 11 years, he managed the sports program for 1st Army for 4 years, and then became Deputy Sports Director for the Dept of Army for 15 years. He culminated his federal career by serving 4 years as Director of the Interservice Sports Committee Secretariat for the Department of Defense.

He also served on the Board of Directors and Executive Committee of the US Olympic Committee, and was selected as assistant manager at the 1964 Tokyo Olympics and the head manager at the 1972 Munich Olympics for the US Track & Field Team. He served on eleven separate Olympic sports committees.

Of all the amateur sports he helped develop, none was closer to his heart than his work with the US Modern Pentathlon and Biathlon Association, for which he served as Secretary from 1961-1972, and as President from 1973-1980. His 19 years of work helping develop this sport resulted in the first team and individual World Championship winners for the US in 1979. He also developed the handicapped start system, which is now in use for the final modern pentathlon running event. He was elected to 3 terms on the International Union of Modern

Pentathlon and Biathlon's Executive Board, following which he was appointed UIPM Honorary Member. Mr Wilson also served as a representative to the Conseil International du Sport Militaire (CISM), who presented him with the Member of Merit Award in 1980.

He enjoyed all sports, was an avid woodworker and especially treasured his family and friends. Survivors include his wife of 68 years, Nadine Nell Wilson, 4 children, 10 grandchildren, and 8 great-grandchildren.

UIPM sends condolences to his family and friends.

*** Americas**

Panamerican/ NORCECA Championships

"The Pan American Championships held in Mexico City, 29 June – 2 July were very successful. The Competition was organized with many categories for men and women - Seniors, Juniors, Youth A, B, C, D. Many countries participated from North, South and Central America.

Facilities for the Competition were excellent. Every facility was within 50 meters. Accommodation and competition was held in the Olympic Training Center in Mexico City.

Everything was perfect except everyday it rained - making the athletes miserable during the riding and running. On Friday it was especially difficult when the women had to ride during the very big storm.

Two winners of the Seniors Pan American Championship show excellent performance. Monica Pinette (CAN) won after very exciting finish between her and Brazilian Yane Marquis when she passed her 20 meters before the finish.

The Men's event was less exciting because Eli Bremer (USA) had a large point advantage before the run, but the fight for the 2nd place was very exciting.



Many talented young athletes competed in the NORCECA competition especially countries like Mexico, Brazil, Guatemala and the first time United States participated in the young category under 16 years old. Pentathlon in North, South and Central American is growing.”

Central America & Caribbean Games

“Five countries participated in the XX Central American and Caribbean Games that were held in Santo Domingo, DR on 21-23 July. As in the Pan American and NORCECA Championships, held in Mexico City in late June, all five events took place in the DR's Olympic Center. The competition format followed the Olympic Games, allowing only two athletes in the individual events.

The competition was well organized, and the many volunteers and officials involved did an excellent job. Lic. Hector Lizardo, President of the Dominican Modern Pentathlon Federation, put a lot of time and effort to bring together the many people who made the competition a great success.

All events were conducted within easy walking distance of one another (150 meters). The weather was not bad and although there was some rain, it was generally sunny, with temperatures around 30°.

Women's Competition: Shooting was won by Jenny Schuverer (PAN) with a score of 180 points. In Fencing, 1st place was taken by Thelma Martinez (MEX), with 1039 points. Swimming was won by Kathia Rodriguez (CUB), with 1188 points. 1st place in Riding was Stephany Garza (GUA) with 1200 points. The overall event was won by Andrea Avena (MEX) after winning the run (5316 points). Katia Rodriguez (CUB) and Thelma Martinez (MEX) fought it out for second and third places respectively; Katia 5180 and Thelma 5160.

Men's Competition: Shooting was won by Yaniel Velasquez (CUB) with a score of 182 points. In Fencing, 1st place was taken by Julio Benjamin (DOM), with 968 points. Swimming was won by Julio Benjamin 2:05.8, with 1280 points. After 3 events first and second place were occupied by two Dominican Julio Benjamin and Jesus Abreu. Riding for Dominican was disaster. Julio rode only 656 Jesus 884. After a riding Dominicans lost any chance to win a medals. 1st place in Riding was Mexican Oscar Soto 1200 points. The last final events running was similar like women, where the battle was between Cuban and Mexican athletes. The overall competition was won by Oscar Soto (MEX) 5428 points. Running won Cuban Yaniel Velasquez finished second over all after close finish over Mexican Julio Granados.”

CAC Games Additional Report

“This was the first time we have the full modern pentathlon in the oldest regional games in the world. The Central American Games bring together 32 nations and have a great potential for growth for us. Vice Admiral Hector Lizardo, President of the Dominican Republic Modern Pentathlon Federation, did a great job staging the event. The facilities were easily of the level of a World Championship, and all five facilities were within a 150 meter radius. I expressed that we hope they will decide to host a World Cup event in the future.

Janusz Peciak and John Holland did a great job as technical delegates working very hard as part of the organization. Mexico also supported with several judges in order to conduct the event in a professional manner.

The level of the nations has increased. Although Mexico and Cuba are still slightly better the margin is much closer. In the men's event after three events the two Dominican Republic athletes were one two in the event, and unfortunately they lost a lot of ground in the riding event. The medal distribution was also nice with four out five nations getting at least one medal. The remaining nation, Panama, helped us out by registering a women's relay and bringing Jenny Schuverer out of retirement to allow us to hold the event officially.

We had the Sports Ministers of Mexico and the Dominican Republic at our awards ceremonies.

We had a spectacular closing ceremony with fireworks and lots of “merengue” music.”
