### IOC

The IOC announced that **6th IOC World Conference on Sport and Environment** will be held 9-11 November 2005 at the headquarters of the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) in Nairobi, Kenya. The agenda for this Conference, organised in partnership with UNEP, features various subjects including policy support, strengthening of partnerships, development and research. The IOC announced that it had received a letter from Dr Un Yong Kim (KOR) dated 9 May, in which Dr Kim informed the IOC President that he resigns from the IOC Vice-Presidency and membership. The IOC Executive Board recognised Mr Kim's resignation which thereby ends the expulsion procedure.

### \* NOCs

On 6 May, the day after the second meeting this year of the **European Olympic Committees (EOC) Executive Committee**, the 26th Seminar for EOC Secretaries General and Chefs de Mission opened in Tirana (Albania). Those attending the seminar, which concluded on 13 May, included representatives of the EOC, the Organising Committees of the forthcoming Olympic Games and the organisers of sports events in Europe. Representatives of the five Candidate Cities for the 2012 Olympic Games were also present. A special session of the seminar was devoted to the 2005-2008 programme of the IOC's Olympic Solidarity.

The next seminar is scheduled for June 2006 in Bucharest (Romania).

On 11 May, at its General Assembly, the **French NOC** re-elected IOC member Henri Sérandour for a fourth four-year term. On the same occasion, the IOC Sport and Fair Play Trophy was presented to Jean-Louis Boujon, President of the French Association for Non-Violent Sport and Fair Play.

WOA President and IOC member Pál Schmitt was re-elected as President of the **Hungarian NOC** on 7 May. IOC member and International Weightlifting Federation (IWF) President Tamás Aján was re-elected as Secretary General. **Attila Császári**, President of the Hungarian Modern Pentathlon Association was elected vice-president whilst **János Pakucs**, organiser of the 1999 Modern Pentathlon World Championships, was elected member of the Auditors Committee.

IOC president Jacques Rogge was the guest of honour at the centenary celebrations of the **British Olympic Association (BOA)** on 24 May. Dr Rogge and other senior IOC figures were the guests at day-long celebrations beginning with a reception at the House of Commons, followed by a visit to the site of the 1908 Olympics in White City, and ending with a dinner in Whitehall. All British gold medallists and multiple medallists were invited and from Modern Pentathlon Dr **Stephanie Cook**, Sydney 2000 Olympic Champion and **Dominic Mahony**, 1988 Seoul Team Bronze medallist attended, as well as UIPM Executive Board member **Martin Dawe**.



### \* 2006 Turin

On 8 May, the logo and name of the **Cultural Olympiad** for the XX Olympic Winter Games in 2006, Italyart, were unveiled at the Turin Book Fair. The logo is very similar to the 2006 Games logo. Eurosport President Angelo Codignoni announced on 4 May in Milan that the 2006 Winter Games will be entirely broadcasted by **Eurosport**, which will also have exclusive access behind the scenes of the Games.

TOROC's **exhibition** "Olympic Winter Games and More" was officially inaugurated on 10 May at the European Parliament in Strasbourg. After its stay in Strasbourg, the exhibition will visit several of the world's major cities including Rome, Beijing, Singapore, and Vancouver.

### \* 2008 Beijing

The 13th Paralympic Games will be held from Saturday 6 September to Wednesday 17 September 2008. This has been confirmed by the IPC to BOCOG, which will be responsible for the organisation of the 2008 Paralympic Games, as well as the Olympic Games. The IPC also announced the sports that would figure on the programme. With the addition of rowing, the programme will now comprise 20 sports, one more than for the Athens Games: athletics, rowing, wheelchair basketball, boccia, cycling, wheelchair fencing, 5-a-side football, 7-a-side football, goalball, judo, swimming, weightlifting, equestrian, wheelchair tennis, table tennis, shooting, archery, wheelchair rugby, sailing and volleyball.



### WADA

The World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) has just published an overview of the results for 2004 reported by its 32 accredited laboratories (available at [www.wada-ama.org](http://www.wada-ama.org)) for in- and out-of-competition testing. Nearly 20,000 more samples were analysed in 2004 than in 2003.

### GAISF

The 68th Congress of the **International Sports Press Association** (AIPS) took place in Marrakech (Morocco) from 12 to 14 May. The delegates elected Gianni Merlo (ITA) to succeed Togay Bayatli (TUR) as AIPS President for the period 2005-2009. Charles Camenzuli (MLT) was re-elected Secretary General.

On 10 May, the **International Equestrian Federation** (FEI) announced the resignation of its Secretary General, Bo Helander. Accepted by the FEI Executive Board, this resignation will be take effect as of 31 August this year. Bo Helander will continue to work with the FEI as Senior Adviser to the Executive Board.



### UIPM

**UIPM President Dr h.c. Klaus Schormann** took part in the Opening Ceremony of the **Seminar for African NOCs** organised by the German NOC in Frankfurt on 9 May and also at a meeting of more than 20 NOCs, represented by their Presidents and/or Secretary Generals, at the City Town Hall on 11 May. During this time, the President also met with IOC members from Germany **Dr Thomas Bach** and **Pr. Walther Tröger** and spoke briefly with other IOC members such as **Patrick Chamunda** (Zambia), **Maj. Gen. Francis W. Nyangweso** (Uganda) and **Dr Kip Keino** (Kenya).

Whilst attending the Women's World Cup in Paris, 12-15 March and the UIPM Business Affairs Committee meeting that took place at the time, **President Klaus Schormann and Secretary General Joel Bouzou** also met with French NOC President **Henri Sérandour** and discussed the Olympic Programme and the development of Modern Pentathlon in France. Dr h.c. Klaus Schormann and Joel Bouzou visited the Racing Club de France in its site of La Croix Catelan with its President Xavier de la Courtie, which has supported Modern Pentathlon for many years.

**UIPM President Klaus Schormann** travelled to Istanbul, Turkey from 18-20 May where he had meetings with Turkish Modern Pentathlon Federation President **Salt Yakut** and his Executive Board. They worked on youth projects for schools and clubs as well as close co-operation with the Military Academy in Istanbul. A document was signed for a project in Berlin, Germany for the Turkish society, which will start October 2005 with the strong support of the German MP Federation and the German government. The UIPM President met briefly with Turkish NOC President **Togay Bayatli** and Secretary General **Nese Gundogan** during which the NOC thanked President Schormann for his ongoing support of the Turkish Olympic Movement.

Mr **Takis Loverdos**, President of the Greek Modern Pentathlon Federation and Vice President of the European Modern Pentathlon Confederation joined the UIPM President in Istanbul and assisted in the discussions for the establishment of the **Balkan Championships** in Modern Pentathlon for all age categories, to take place next year. The Greek Federation will work closely with the Turkish Federation and Takis Loverdos has informed Turkish MP President **Salt Yakut** in a letter:-  
"The Hellenic Modern Pentathlon Federation together with the Turkish could be seen as an



example through the common steps of this co-operation. These two countries are and will be neighbours and are obliged, apart from the sensitive part of the political condition which govern this relationship, to look for common signs of communication and intercourse. Sports unite the nations, unite the world. Either as President of the Hellenic Modern Pentathlon Federation or as Vice President of the European Modern Pentathlon Confederation, I will always be close to the Turkish Modern Pentathlon, with a view to multi-dimensional and multi-beneficial cooperation for the years to come.”

On 23 May in Lausanne, Switzerland, **UIPM President Klaus Schormann** and **UIPM Secretary General Joël Bouzou** met with United States Olympic Committee (USOC) Chairman **Peter Ueberroth** to discuss the next steps for Modern Pentathlon in the US, including the creation of a new national governing body. This meeting was followed by a second meeting at the UIPM Headquarters in Monaco the following day between UIPM Secretary General Joël Bouzou and from USOC, Director Sports **Partnerships Rebecca Crawford** and Chief of Sport Performance **Steven Roush**.

During last week's International Championships for Women in Bonn, Germany, the **UIPM President** discussed with **Kim Raisner**, member of the UIPM Athletes' Committee issues concerning the needs of athletes from less developed countries and the Olympic future of Modern Pentathlon. With **Peter Kroner**, member of the European Confederation Executive Board, the President discussed the development of new countries, e.g. Ireland, Turkey and Malta.

#### **General Assembly of the International Pierre de Coubertin Committee (CIPC)**

The International Pierre de Coubertin Committee (CIPC) held his General Assembly the 28th of May in Bolbec/France. 40 members from 12 countries were present. Bolbec is situated 3 km from the Chateau de Mirville, the residence of the Pierre de Coubertin family in Normandy.

The UIPM was represented by Mrs. Elena Malikova (Slovakia), member of the UIPM Coubertin Commission. CIPC president Dr. Norbert Müller underlined in his annual report for 2004 the close cooperation with UIPM, especially concerning the UIPM exposition in Athens 2004 and the ARTE/SWR film production “Coubertin yesterday and today”.

Geoffrey de Navacelle de Coubertin (86), Honorary President of the CIPC and senior of the Coubertin family gave a successful reception, assisted by

wonderful weather, in the Chateau of Mirville, which was enjoyed by all the guests.

#### **UIPM signs 4-year agreement with Speedo**

#### Italy

#### Russia

UIPM also congratulates Olympic Champion **Andrei Moiseev** as seen from this extract of a news story: MOSCOW, May 13 (RIA Novosti sports writer Mikhail Smirnov) This year the traditional, third national sports prize GLORY shall be for the first time awarded for the results of the Olympic year. It is not surprising, therefore, that outstanding Russian athletes - winners of the Olympic Games in Athens - are listed among the contenders for the prize in ten nominations. Interesting names figure in the Discovery of the Year nomination. They are Olympic champion in track cycling Mikhail Ignatyev, Champion of the Athens Olympics in Modern Pentathlon **Andrei Moiseev**, Olympic champion in the high jump Yelena Slyusarenko, and Wimbledon winner Maria Sharapova."

#### World Cup#3 Women, Paris (FRA)

The World Cup for Women was perfectly organised by the French MP Federation under the leadership of its President Alain Gelès at the prestigious and historical site of Racing Club de France in La Croix Catelan, located in the west of Paris. This green area will be used for Olympic Modern Pentathlon if Paris is successful in winning the vote to host the 2012 Olympic Games and is the place where the running track of the 1900 and 1924 Olympic Games has still been preserved. RCF is one of the oldest clubs in France and the best French MP club today. The World Cup was organised with the support of the Republican Guard which provided the very well trained horses, and the weather was perfect throughout the week end.

The Final took place on 15 May, with Léna SCHONEBORN (GER) and Hanna ARKHIPENKA (BLR) starting the day off in joint lead after the Shoot, both achieving 184 Target points (1144 MP points). But the Olympic Champion from Hungary, Szuzsanna VOROS, soon took over the lead, winning the Fence jointly with Edita MALOSZYC (POL) with 23 victories. Adding the 1300 MP points (for 2.15.2) from her 2<sup>nd</sup> place in the Swim, VOROS kept her lead after 3 events, with MALOSZYC in 2<sup>nd</sup>

and Claudia CORSINI in 3<sup>rd</sup> as the athletes moved to the Ride/Run arena.

3 athletes managed perfect scores of 1200 points in the Ride – Lada JIENBALANOVA (KAZ), Csilla FURI (HUN), and Alexandra KALINOVSKA (CZE), but despite only achieving 1076 points, Szuzsanna VOROS extended her lead to start the Run over half a minute ahead of FURI and kept her 1<sup>st</sup> place across the finish line. Behind her, Edita MALOSZYC and Claudia CORSINI both overtook Csilla Furi on the 3000m course to take 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place respectively.

The following Executive Board Members attended the World Cup: President Klaus Schormann, Secretary General Joël Bouzou and Sport Director Mauro Tirinnanzi; and the members of the Business Affairs Committee meeting in Paris at this time attended the Final including from the EB: Vice President John Helmick, Treasurer Gyula Bretz, Marketing Director Martin Dawe, Media Director Pernille Svarre and Athletes Representative Stefano Giommoni. The Technical Delegate was Ivar Brandelius and the Medical Supervisor Dr Maria Cascais.

#### World Cup#3 Men, Budapest (HUN)

76 competitors, including 15 of the current World's Top 20 pentathletes, from Asia, Africa, Europe and the Americas took part in the penultimate World Cup for Men. The qualification competitions on Friday 13th were unlucky for all but the 32 successful finalists, with 17 countries represented in the Finals on 15 May.

Andrejus ZADNEPROVSKIS (LTU) and Michal MICHALIK (CZE) tied the Shoot with 189 target points (1204 MP points), in an event which was probably the highest standard seen in a Modern Pentathlon competition to date, with the lowest score being an above average 1012 MP points ! Winning the Fencing with 22 Victories, pushed QIAN Zhenhua (CHN) to the top of the table after 2 events. ZADNEPROVSKIS with 20 Victories and 944 MP points put him in 2nd place after 2 events. Notable in the Fence also was Carlos SOROLLA (ESP) in 2nd place with 21 victories, and this put him 3rd after 2 events as the athletes moved to the nearby pool. In the pool, without Andrei Moiseev (RUS) who was not in Budapest, all eyes were on Eric WALTHER (GER) but it was Dzmitry MELIAKH (BLR) who took the fastest swim in an amazing time of 1.57.84: Eric WALTHER was also sub 2 minutes, in 2nd with 1.58.49. But QIAN remains top of the table after 3 events, only 12 points ahead of ZADNEPROVSKIS, with team mate LIU Yang in 3rd.

At the ride, only LEE Choon Huan (KOR) and Gabor BALOGH (HUN) managed clear rounds,



though just outside the time limit to receive 1180 MP points each, so QIAN remained in 1st position at the start of the Run, but with ZADNEPROVSKIS only 5 seconds behind. The latter soon overtook QIAN and Andrejus ZADNEPROVSKIS extended his lead to take first place on the podium. With the vocal support of his home crowd, Gabor BALOGH, starting out in 4th place, moved up two, to take 2nd place on the podium, and QIAN Zhenhua hang on to come in 3rd. Fastest runner, as in Leipzig a few weeks ago, was Samuel FELIX (MEX), blitzing 3000m in 9.27.09 which moved him from his 25th start place to finish 11th overall.

The World Cup for Men took place in the presence of IOC member **Pál Schmitt**, who is also President of the Hungarian NOC, as well as other high level representatives of local and national authority. The members of the European MP Confederation Executive Board attended the Final, including its President and UIPM EB member Dmitry Svatkovsky. The Technical Delegate was Vladimir Miller and the Medical Supervisor Natalia Ofitserova.

The Executive Board of the European Modern Pentathlon Confederation met in Budapest at the time of the Men's World Cup, 12-15 May.

### **South America**

Until the 4 June, Confederation President José Rodriguez will be making visits to Argentina, Uruguay and Paraguay, and he describes the purpose as follows :-

ARGENTINA: Meeting with the President and Board of the Federation in order to deal with administrative and sportive matters concerning the Pan American and South American Championship to take place in October 5 through 8, 2005 in Buenos Aires. Attendance the General Assembly and visit to the President of the Olympic Committee of Argentina.

URUGUAY: Meeting with the President and Board of the Federation and interviews with civil and military sport authorities to promote further support to our sport in that country, for they have a reduced number of athletes.

PARAGUAY: In my report delivered at the Executive Committee Meeting in Lausanne, SUI 27-28 January 2005, I stated I would continue working on my endeavor to incorporate more countries to the South American Confederation, and Paraguay is my next strategic goal. I have gone further on my dealings with the Head of the Physical Training Academy of the Army of Paraguay and my intention is to make a presentation to the sport authorities from the Olympic Committee and the Army, so that they can jointly develop Modern Pentathlon in Paraguay.

### Technical Committee

UIPM Technical Committee Chairman, Mauro Tirinnanzi represented UIPM at the CISM Modern Pentathlon Championships which took place last weekend in Prague, Czech Republic.

### Business Affairs Committee

The UIPM Business Affairs Committee held their first meeting of the four year period in conjunction with the Pentathlon Women's World Cup held in Paris on May 13-16. The first day sessions focused on communication and promotion activities including the UIPM Monthly Newsletter, UIPM Magazine, UIPM Media Guide, UIPM Television Broadcast rights, Website design, and Database management. The second day session focused on economics for competition organizers. The BAC discussion on competition economics was lead by special guest, UIPM Technical Committee Chairman, Maura Tirinnanzi. Recommendations for practical support of competition organizers and training of new organizers through services provided by UIPM were developed. The recommendations of the BAC will be forwarded to the UIPM Executive Board for decision and approval.

### Athletes Committee

The Athletes Committee' activities at World Cup #3 in Paris. Report from Stefano Giommoni, UIPM Athletes' Committee Chairman

At the World Cup Competition in Paris, the AC was present with its Chairman Stefano Giommoni and one of its three Members, Kim Raisner.

While Stefano Giommoni was attending the Business Affairs Commission Meeting scheduled during the whole weekend, to represent the athletes in the discussions of several issues, concerning budgeting, economics, marketing, media coverage, etc, Kim Raisner, who was in Paris also to take part to the WC competition, held an important meeting with the athletes on the rest day before the final. The meeting, held at the hotel where the athletes were staying, was a great success; in fact thanks to the many athletes who showed up, it has been possible to discuss important matters such Olympic Qualifications System for 2008, World Cups and World Cup Final prize money, relay competition, competition standards for major competitions (accommodation, meals, schedules, competitions venues, prizes, media coverage, sponsors, etc), rules improvement or changes opinions and suggestions about PWR Pentathlon World Ranking.

The meeting didn't take too much rest time to the athletes, it lasted 45 minutes about; this kind of meetings are the most important opportunity the Athletes have to meet and see their representatives, and above all to speak their voice and to express their ideas; that's why the AC planned to have at least two more important meetings before the end of the season, one in Montepulciano, during the European Championships and one in Warsaw during the Worlds. The one planned for Warsaw is supposed to be the most important of the year because of the large number of participants coming from all over the world and also because all the AC Members will be present.

The AC is trying to have those meetings as official part of the program in order to have a better communication of them among the national federations and therefore a larger participation of athletes to those meetings.

The meeting held in Paris was not the first arranged by the AC this year, in fact there was have been another successful one in Leipzig during the men's WC #2. During that meeting, Kim Raisner (who attended it) and the athletes discussed about the same matters mentioned above; some sheets concerning those matters, were distributed to the athletes by Kim together with the individual printed profiles and contacts of the four AC's representatives (Stefano Giommoni, Kim Raisner, Kate Allenby and Vaho Iagoraschvili).

### Medical Committee

Meeting of the Olympic IFs Chairpersons - Lausanne 24 May 2005. Report from Pr Fabio Pigozzi, UIPM Medical Committee Chairman

The meeting was attended by 30 IFs Olympic representatives (of the possible 35). The IOC Medical Director, Dr. Patrick Schamasch reported on the activities of the IOC Medical and Scientific Department and on the Athens Games. He also reported on the project by the Medicine and Science group on triad, women and sport.

Among the others, it was discussed the issue related to the IOC Programme on Safety in sport and Beta-2 Agonists and the independent panel for therapeutic use exemption, following the experience of the Athens Games.

With respect to the topic on the fight against doping - relations with WADA it was discussed the list of prohibited substance and methods in force. The following comments, useful for the finalization for the 2006 Prohibited List were discussed:

#### Main formal questions on TUEs

- Standardization of "strict" medical criteria for TUEs approvals, and "duration" of TUE certificates.



- Transition of athletes from National to International-Level athletes, and validity of existing national TUEs.
- Acceptance of "threshold" for mutual recognition of TUE acceptance.

#### Main proposals for 2006 Prohibited List

- Stimulants : different classes for weak or strong stimulants.
- Glucocorticosteroids :  
1)laboratory minimum cut-off limit for positivity;  
2)permission, without TUE, of nasal, aural and ophthalmologic preparations (as dermatological).
- THC : in the list of substances prohibited in particular sports.

#### Main ethical questions on the 2005 Prohibited List

- HCG prohibited in females.
- Intravenous infusions for legitimate (and not emergency only !) medical purposes.
- Artificial simulated altitude systems.
- Autologous growth factors for orthopaedic surgery.
