IOC

The new composition of the **IOC commissions** was announced at the beginning of the month. In all, the members of 24 commissions, the audit committee, the delegate members and the IOC members on the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) Foundation Board have been appointed. There is also a new 2009 Congress Commission which will be in charge of preparations for the Congress in Copenhagen. The names of the chairpersons and members of all the commissions can be found on www.olympic.org. The IOC President awarded the **Olympic Order** to IOC honorary member Nikos Filaretos who has been International Olympic Academy President for 30 years. The ceremony was held in the presence of IOC honorary member and UIPM Patron King Constantine.

On 12 May, the IOC President chaired the discussions of the **International Olympic Truce Foundation** (IOTF), which met at the IOC headquarters.

IOC President Jacques Rogge was in London on 16 May to sign the extension to the **partnership between the IOC and Omega**, official timekeeper for the Games, through to 2012. Also present were IOC Marketing Commission Chairman Gerhard Heiberg; Sebastian Coe, Chairman of the Organising Committee for the 2012 Games in London (LOCOG); LOCOG CEO Paul Deighton;

Colin Moynihan and Simon Clegg, respectively Chairman and Secretary General of the British Olympic Association; Swatch Group CEO Nick Hayek; and the President of Omega, Stephen Urquhart.

On 18 May, the IOC President chaired a meeting of the **International Relations Commission** at Olympic House.

The IOC was deeply saddened to learn on 26 May of the death of **Dr Kevin O'Flanagan**, an IOC member from 1976 to 1995 and an honorary member since 1995. Born in Dublin in 1919, Dr O'Flanagan played a major role in the field of Olympic sports medicine over several decades. He was a member of the British Olympic Medical Commission at the Games of the XIV Olympiad in London in 1948 and also an Olympic team doctor from 1960 to 1976. Member for Ireland on the Sports Medicine Committee of the Council of Europe for six years, he was also Vice-President of the Irish NOC. Elected as an IOC member in 1976, Dr O'Flanagan was a member of the Medical Commission from 1980 to 1994, and of the Olympic Programme (summer) Commission from 1993 to 1994. A keen sportsman, he was Irish 60 yards, 100 yards and long jump champion, as well as playing for his country internationally in rugby and football. The Olympic Movement expresses its deepest sympathy to Dr Kevin O'Flanagan's family.



*NOCs

The **Oceania National Olympic Committees** (ONOC) celebrated its 25th anniversary at its General Assembly in Nadi (Fiji) on 12 and 13 May. As well as the representatives of the 16 ONOC member NOCs, it was attended by the Secretary General of the Association of National Olympic Committees (ANOC) and IOC Vice- President Gunilla Lindberg, and a delegation from BOCOG. During the Assembly, ONOC Merit Awards were presented to a number of individuals for their contribution to ONOC during its first 25 years of existence. Certificates of recognition were also presented to individuals and organisations that have contributed for more than 10 years to the development of Olympism and sport, its values and ideals within the Oceania region.

The Executive Committee of the **Association of National Olympic Committees of Africa** (ANOCA) held its 30th Ordinary Session this week in Algiers (Algeria). On this occasion, an agreement on the Afro-Asian Games was signed by ANOCA and the Algerian Minister for Youth and Sport. These Games will take place from 26 July to 3 August 2007 in Algiers, just after the 9th African Games.

On 9 May, Mario Pescante announced his decision to resign as President of the **European Olympic Committees** (EOC) owing to his re-election to the Italian Parliament last April. An Extraordinary EOC Assembly will be held in Rome (Italy) on 29 July to address the new situation within the EOC.

On 20 May in Frankfurt-am-Main (Germany), the IOC President and German Chancellor Angela Merkel attended the official launch of the **German Olympic Sports Federation** (Deutscher Olympischer Sportbund), following the merger of the German Sports Federation and the German Olympic Committee. IOC Vice President Thomas Bach was elected unopposed as President of the new organisation. **UIPM President Klaus Schormann**, who had been a member of the DOSB Nominations Commission, attended its 1st General Assembly as well as the official ceremony held in St Paul's Church in Frankfurt.

* IOC Culture and Olympic Education Commission

The new IOC Commissions announced by the IOC this month, confirmed officially the re-appointment of **UIPM President Klaus Schormann** as member of the IOC Commission for Culture and Olympic Education. The UIPM President has been a member of the Commission since 1994.



* 2008 Beijing

The **Coordination Commission** for the Games held its sixth plenary meeting in Beijing. The three days of meetings included a venue tour that allowed the Commission members to get a first-hand look at the development of some of the iconic venues that Beijing is building for the Games. The members also heard about the legacy that these venues will provide to the local communities, the city of Beijing and China as a whole, once the Olympic competitions are over. The meetings illustrated that BOCOG has now entered an important period in its journey towards the Games in 2008, as it moves from a planning focus to a more operational and client-focused phase in its lifecycle. The next full Commission meeting in Beijing will be towards the end of 2006, and the Commission will continue to visit the host city on a twice-yearly basis until the Games are held in 2008.

The **Programme** for the 2008 Games has been finalised. In all, there will be 28 sports comprising 302 events: 165 men's, 127 women's and 10 mixed. Several events and a new discipline (BMX) have been included on the programme: the women's 3,000 metres steeplechase, men's and women's BMX, women's team foil and sabre, and men's and women's 10km swimming, whilst the doubles events in table tennis have been replaced by team events. The total of 127 women's events in Beijing is two more than for Athens, and an additional 130 women will be competing.

The **XIII Paralympic Games** will take place from 6 to 17 September 2008 in Beijing. On the programme are 20 sports, 18 of which will be organised in the Chinese capital, while the sailing competition will take place in Qingdao and the equestrian events will be staged in Hong Kong, China. About 4,000 athletes, 2,500 coaches and officials from some 150 countries and 4,000 media representatives are expected.

BOCOG has announced that the **second World Broadcasters Meeting** will take place from 9-11 August 2006 in Beijing. More than 300 representatives from radio and television rights-holding broadcasters for the 2008 Games will participate. BOCOG also announced that the **first World Press Briefing** will be held in Beijing from 25-29 September 2006. More than 100 delegates representing most of the major press agencies and newspapers, as well as some broadcast organisations, NOCs and IFs are expected on this occasion. The IOC Press Commission will hold its annual meeting on 25 September in Beijing.



* 2012 London

LOCOG has announced the appointment of Jean Tomlin as **Human Resources Director**. Jean Tomlin, who is currently an adviser to the BBC, will take up her position in August. LOCOG currently has around 80 staff, and this figure is expected to increase to 3,000 by 2012.

International Sport issues

* GAISF

Princess Haya Bint Al Hussein of Jordan was elected as the 13th President of the **International Equestrian Federation (FEI)**. The election was held on 1 May during the FEI General Assembly in Kuala Lumpur. Princess Haya Bint Al Hussein began competing in international equestrian events at the age of 13. In 1992, she won a bronze medal at the Pan Arab Games. She also took part in the Games of the XXVII Olympiad in Sydney in 2000. The new FEI President takes over from IOC member the Infanta Doña Pilar de Borbón. On 12 May, the FEI announced that Jean-Claude Falciola has resigned as interim Secretary General with immediate effect. He will be replaced by Sports Director Michael Stone, who will hold both positions until a new permanent Secretary General is appointed.

As of 8 May, the **International Association Football Association (FIFA)** has a new **headquarters** at the following address: FIFA-Strasse 20, P.O. Box, 8044 Zurich (Switzerland). The official inauguration of the building will take place at the end of May 2007 during the 57th Ordinary FIFA Congress.

* WADA

WADA presented a Government Update Report on the **Copenhagen Declaration** and the UNESCO International Convention against Doping in Sport to the Agency's Executive Committee and Foundation Board at their meetings on 13-14 May 2006. This document is an updated version of the report presented to the IOC Session on 8 February 2006, immediately prior to the Turin Olympic Games.

WADA has published a new issue of **Play True** Magazine on its global mission. This issue covers WADA's involvement in various regions of the world, with a focus on the establishment of Regional Anti-Doping Organizations (RADOs). Other features include WADA's Education Symposia around the world, new online resources for stakeholders, and a look back at the Agency's presence at the Turin Olympic and Paralympic Games. * CISM

President Gianni Gola was re-elected for a third mandate at CISM's 61st General Assembly held in Rome, Italy from 15 till 22 May.

* CIJM

At its last meeting held in Pescara (Italy), the Executive Committee of the **International Mediterranean Games Committee** officially set the date of the XVI Mediterranean Games, in agreement with the organisers of these Games. These will therefore be held from 26 June to 5 July 2009 in Pescara.

UIPM President's Activities

On 5 May, President Klaus Schormann attended a memorial ceremony held in Salem for Patron and Honorary Member of the German Modern Pentathlon Federation HRH Prince George of Hanover, who had died in Munich on 8 January aged 90 years (see UIPM January 2006 Newsletter for obituary).

The UIPM President held meetings in Berlin on 6-7 May with regard to preparations for next year's Senior World Championships.

President Klaus Schormann took part in Bonn on 8 May at the final meeting of the 'International Year of Sport and Physical education 2005 in Germany' hosted by the Parliamentary State Secretary Dr. Christoph Bergner, which was arranged under the patronage of the United Nations.

From 10-14 May, President Klaus Schormann was in Japan where he attended the **2006 World Conference on Women and Sport**. The Conference was held 11-14 May at the Kumamoto Nikko Hotel and the Kumamoto Prefectural Community Center and organised under the auspices of the International Working Group on Women and Sport (IWG) and jointly hosted by the local governments of Kumamoto City and Kumamoto Prefecture, the Japanese Olympic Committee (JOC) and the Japanese Association for Women in Sport (JWS). It follows those held in Great Britain (1994), Namibia (1998) and Canada (2002). 707 participants from all 5 continents took part. The next edition will be held in Australia in 2010. During the Conference, President Klaus Schormann discussed with Mrs Carol Garoes, Secretary



General of the African Women in Sport Association (AWISA) from Namibia the future activities of Modern Pentathlon in her home country. A similar discussion was held with Prof. Florence Bola Adeyanju from Nigeria, founder of the Nigerian Association of Women in Sport (NAWIS). With Mrs Jachline Al Dugom, member of the Women's Committee of the NOC of Jordan, the UIPM President spoke about the development of Modern Pentathlon in the Islamic Society including also for women, citing Egypt as a good example. Mrs Al Dugom confirmed her strong support in the creation of a national MP federation in Jordan. With Mrs Lilamani de Soysa, project Manager in the International Table Tennis Federation, President Klaus Schormann discussed the future cooperation for the development of women in sport with the International Sport Federations working much closer in this field in the future. President Klaus Schormann will cooperate as well with Prof. Jinxia Dong, Director of the Research Centre for Gender, Sport, Society at the Beijing University, in the field of Women in sport to further develop the culture of Physical Education for girls and to work on strategies to use sport as a tool for peace and development.

During this Conference, the UIPM President spoke briefly with NOC President Tsunekazu Takeda about the forthcoming **UIPM Congress** in Kyoto, 12-16 December 2006, which will be the 2nd time the UIPM Congress has been held in Japan following the Tokyo Olympic Congress in 1964. Together with Secretary General Dr Kikuchi Takayuki of the Japan Modern Pentathlon & Biathlon Union and Mrs Yuki Mimura, lecturer at the Department of Physical Education National Defense Academy, President Klaus Schormann worked on the schedule for the UIPM Congress and finalised the programme.

The UIPM President gave a lecture to the Lions Club Darmstadt-Castrum on the theme of 'Sport and Ethics' on 20 May.

On 20 May, President Klaus Schormann hosted in a dinner in the name of DOSB and its President Thomas Bach for IOC member and Austrian NOC President Dr Leo Wallner, Korean NOC President Mr Jung-Kil Kim and Secretary General Sang-Woo Kim in Frankfurt after the official celebrations of the new DOSB in St Paul's Church. They discussed issues of the Olympic Movement in general and cooperation between IFs and NOCs.

Together with UIPM Sports Director Mauro Tirinnanzi, President Klaus Schormann attended the 38th **World Military Modern Pentathlon Championships** in Kaunas, Lithuania, 25-29 May. During the event, they discussed with the new CISM Director General Affairs Col. Alexandre Morisod and Sports Director Lt. Col. Cellos Silva new steps for a better cooperation between CISM and UIPM. President Klaus Schormann will have another meeting with them in Brussels 4-5 July 2006. After the Opening Ceremony on 25 May, the UIPM President discussed with Mr Valdemaras Sarapinas, State Secretary of the Ministry of Defence of the Republic of Lithuania, the importance of the support of sport through the Ministries of Defence world wide. Close communication and cooperation between civilian and military societies through sport will help for a better understanding and more peaceful world.

On 26 May, President Klaus Schormann visited the Lithuanian Academy of Physical Education and met with Vice-Rector Dr Gediminas Mamkas and Vice-Rector Dr Remigijus Gulbinas and Chairman of International Relations office Mr Tomas Kukenys. Mr Nerijus Pacevicius, President of the National Modern Pentathlon Federation of Lithuania, and Secretary General Mr Viaceslavas Kalinias accompanied President Klaus Schormann. The main issue of discussion was the development of Modern Pentathlon through University sport based on their researches in training systems, medical researches, biomechanical and physical educational experiences. This Academy established a special project for Modern Pentathlon since some years.

UIPM Sports Director in Kaunas and Riga

Sports Director Mauro Tirinnanzi reports:

I arrived yesterday night from the CISM World Championship that took place in Kaunas. I also had a meeting in Riga with the organisers of the next European Championship valid to qualified 16 athletes for the Beijing Olympic Games.

In **Kaunas** together with the UIPM President Klaus Schormann, I assisted at a very well organised competition extremely strong especially for the men, and a lot of the horses were fantastic. In Kaunas we took the opportunity to meet the new CISM Director Colonel Alexander Morisod and all the CISM Pentathlon staff. With Colonel Morisod we instituted a very good and useful collaboration and we scheduled a series of future activities to develop modern pentathlon especially with the not so active Countries. Col Morisod was very enthusiastic of modern pentathlon, open to a



common partnership and really a new friend for our sport. The CISM organisers were perfect organisers. The Lithuanian Federation and its President Nerijus Pacevicius demonstrated a great interest to start to organise competitions in the near future. So the UIPM can count with a new organiser in this area, the Baltic Area, which is rich with good talent, strong in modern pentathlon knowledge, and enthusiastic.

Particularly useful has been my visit to **Riga** that will host the 2007 European Championships. I visited the hotel that will host all the athletes: Islande Hotel is a very good new hotel (all the information can be found on www.islandehotel.lv). The Hotel is 10 minutes from Riga international airport and walking distance from the swimming pool (50m) and 300m from the exhibition centre where the fencing and shooting will take place. In this area it will be also possible to organise the running for the qualification competitions. 15/20 minutes from the hotel is located the Equestrian centre. It has two adjacent perfect riding arenas, one in sand and the other in grass. It is proposed to organise the competition in the grass competition arena. At the equestrian centre will be organised also the running competitions for the final. The Running course is on grass and is flat. I was perfectly assisted in my visit by Mr Andris Feldmanis Latvian Olympic Committee Vice President and former strong pentathlete. During my visit I met the Olympic Committee President Aldonis Vrubleskis and the Olympic Committee General Secretary Einars Fogelis. Mr Feldmanis confirmed that the European Championships will take place from the 6 to 12 June 2007. With him, I had a long and useful meeting, the focus on the technical aspects of the competition, in particularly on the five pentathlon sports, the horses, the judges, the results system service, and also on logistics and transport. Very important and friendly was my meeting with the Latvian President who guarantees all the maximum effort to organise a perfect competition. I am sure that they have all the possibilities, sport venue and sport facilities, the background, the knowledge and the passion to organise a very good European Championship. I want to thank the Latvian Federation, President Gaidis Andrejs Zeibots and Secretary General Vladimir Kravcov for the help that give to me for my visit in Riga, and the Lithuanian Federation, President Nerijus Pacevicius and Secretary General Mr Viaceslavas Kalinias for their friendly hospitalities.

The UIPM President will be in Szekesfehervar for the World Cup #4 Women, 1-4 June, where he will meet with UIPM Treasurer Gyula Bretz.

The UIPM Auditors Alexandr Peirits and Jiri Hrdlicka met at UIPM Headquarters from 17-20 May and successfully completed their mission. During this time, they had several meetings with Treasurer Gyula Bretz, Secretary General Joël Bouzou and assistant to the Secretary General, Tine Thomsen.

UIPM Secretary General Joël Bouzou appointed Sport Advisor for HSH Prince Albert II of Monaco

UIPM is proud to announce that Secretary General Joël Bouzou has been appointed Sport Advisor for HSH Prince Albert II of Monaco. This task consists of analysing all sports related opportunities, both nationally and internationally, which interest the Monegasque Leader or the Principality. Joel has a vast experience of sport, both as an athlete and an official. Between 1980 and 1992, he participated in 4 Olympic Games, winning a bronze medal in the Modern Pentathlon team event in Los Angeles. He was also individual World Champion in 1987.



World Cup #4 Men, Budapest, 11-14 May

A high level qualification competition resulted in several top level athletes not making Sunday's final, including World Champion Zhenhua Qian, so excitement was guaranteed in Budapest. Sandor Fulep (HUN) and Yahor Lapo (BLR) took the lead following the Shoot, with 1204 MP points, 189 target points and Cyril Viala (FRA) in 3rd.

Edvinas Krungolcas (LTU) won the Fence 23 victories against 8 defeats for 1028 MP points. Jaime Lopez (ESP) was a close lead for a while, but dropped to 3rd in the event with 20 victories, overtaken by Vitaliy Budovsky (UKR) with 21 victories. After 2 events, Krungolcas was in the lead, Budovsky in 2nd and **Viktor Horvath** (HUN) in 3rd.

4 sub 2 minute swims were achieved in the 25m pool, the event won by Olympic Champion **Andrei Moiseev** (RUS) in 1:56.70, Cao Zhongrong (CHN) was 2nd fastest with 1:57.32 and after 3 events,



Krungalcas maintained his lead with 3500 MP points, Horvath moved up to 2nd with 3396 MP points and fellow Hungarian Robert Kasza in 3rd with 3372 points.

At the ride, only **Michael Brandt** (SWE) managed a perfect round for 1200 points, though **Eli Bremer** (USA) also cleared all the obstacles but was one second outside the time limit and dropped 4 points. But there was no change at the top for Krungalcas and Horvath after 4 events and Krungalcas started the run 26 seconds ahead of Horvath, with Robert Kasza (HUN) 46 seconds behind the leader.

Edvinas Krungalcas was under no threat throughout the 3000 metres and easily crossed the finish line to take 1st place. **Viktor Horvath** came in 2nd, whilst a fast run from 6th placed Russian **Aleksei Turkin** ensured him the 3rd spot on the podium. **Ilija Frolov** (RUS) was the fastest runner of the 32 athletes, clocking in at 9:20.68.

World Cup #3 Women, Moscow, 11-14 May

In Moscow, **Tatsiana Klimovich** (BLR) took the early lead, winning the Shoot with 188 target points (1192 MP points) but the win in the Fence from **Zsuzsanna Voros** (HUN) with 22 victories for 1000 MP points put the 2004 Olympic Champion in the lead after 2 events. 2nd place in the Fence gave **Lucie Grolichova** (CZE) 2nd place overall. **Sheila Taormina** (USA) was the unsurprising winner of the Swim event, 2:06.20 giving her 1408 MP points, but the lead after 3 events remained unchanged.

Elen Rublevska (LAT) and Lena **Schoneborn** (GER) were the only athletes to score the perfect 1200 in the Ride, whilst Amelie Caze (FRA) and Qian Chen (CHN) both had clear rounds though incurred time penalties.

The better Ride of **Lucie Grolichova** put her 32 MP points in the lead from **Zsuzsanna Voros** after 4 events and with the 8 second head start in the run, she was able to hold off the World's Number One athlete to take first place on the Winner's Podium for the first time in her career. Zsuzsanna Voros came in 2nd place and **Tatiana Mouratova** (RUS) starting out in 6th position and 38 seconds behind the lead, took 3rd place. **Viktoriiia Tereschuk** (UKR) ran the fastest 3000m in 10 minutes and 23 seconds.

Biathle World Championships 2006

All National Federations will have received this month by email the invitation letter, entry forms and accommodation booking offer for the Biathle World Championships at Salford Quays in Manchester (Great Britain) on 3 September. For the first time, a **Commonwealth Championships** will take place as part of this World event as part of UIPM's global
