IOC

The **6th IOC World Conference on Sport and the Environment** was held 9-10 November 2005 in Nairobi, Kenya, at the headquarters of the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP), the IOC's main partner in the organisation of the conference. The conference was organised by the IOC Sport and Environment Commission and IOC Vice-President Gunilla Lindberg conveyed a message from IOC President Jacques Rogge to all the participants. The speech made by 2004 Nobel Peace Prize winner Wangari Maathai was one of the highlights of the conference, which adopted a final declaration underlining the Olympic Movement's attachment to the principles of sustainable development. This text can be consulted on www.olympic.org. Representing UIPM, President Klaus Schormann attended the Conference.

* NOCS

Former Olympic high-jump champion Stefka Kostadinova has been elected President of the **Bulgarian NOC**. Kostadinova won the gold medal at the Atlanta Games in 1996, and the silver at the Seoul Games in 1988. She still holds the world record set in Rome in 1987, where she cleared the 2.09 metre bar.

The Swiss sport parliament has elected Jürg Schild as the new President of the **Swiss Olympic Association**. Mr Schild succeeds Walther Kägi, who had been head of the Swiss NOC for the past five years.

* Olympic Museum

In the framework of the "Finding the roots of Sport. Origins – rites – identities" exhibition currently being held at the Olympic Museum, the Museum Education and Cultural Services section is offering teachers an educational programme devoted to traditional sports. This consists of an educational kit based on an interactive and interdisciplinary approach. Thanks to school and extra-curricular activities, the kit is an invitation to think (from the starting point of traditional sports and their links with modern or Olympic sports) about sport as a heritage, its status with regard to culture, and finally, to reflect on the values it can promote in society. * 2006 Turin

The IOC issued the **IOC Anti-Doping Rules** which will be applicable in relation to the Games of the XX Olympic Winter Games in Turin. This important document has been sent to the National Olympic Committees, the International Winter Sport Federations and the Anti-Doping Agencies. With 1,200 tests during the Games, the number of tests will increase by 45% in Turin, compared to Salt Lake City. The IOC authorised WADA to carry out Doping Controls, on behalf of the IOC, during the Period of the Olympic Winter Games.



On 2 November, exactly 100 days before the Games, the **Olympic Truce** programme was presented, in partnership with UNICEF, to support the vote on the Olympic Truce that took place on 3 November in the United Nations headquarters in New York.

Sport, information, Olympic values and practical visitor's guide are the ingredients of the newly launched 2006 Games website at www.torino2006.org. The new website was conceived with the aim of guaranteeing permanent, real time information on winter sports, providing all the information needed for participating in the Olympic event and continuous news updates.

* 2008 Beijing

The Organising Committee for the Games of the XXIX Olympiad in Beijing in 2008 (BOCOG) unveiled its five **official mascots** at a gala organised in the Chinese capital to mark the 1,000-day countdown to the Games Opening Ceremony. The mascots consist of five figures, officially named the Five Friendlies. They include Beibei the Fish, Jingjing the Panda, Huanhuan the Olympic Flame, Yingying the Tibetan Antelope, and Nini the Swallow. The first characters of their rhythmic two-syllable names form a line that reads "Beijing Huanying Ni," or in English "Welcome to Beijing." The mascots' colours reflect those of the Olympic rings.

After three days of fruitful meetings, the **IOC Coordination Commission** for the Games in Beijing concluded on a positive note its fifth visit to the host city of these Games. The Commission expressed its satisfaction with regard to the progress of the preparations. The Commission also underlined that BOCOG and the Chinese authorities were handling Games-related issues over and above purely technical sporting aspects through projects aiming to offer Green Olympic Games and People's Olympic Games. The Commission noted the impressive progress made since its last visit. There remains much to be done, however. The Commission made a detailed examination of a number of key sectors: relations with other cities hosting Olympic events, sport, construction, marketing, communications, Olympic torch relay, NOC relations, media operations, Games time services, etc.

BOCOG announced that the **Sohu.Com SA** company had been chosen as the official Internet content service sponsor. A completely new version of the official website was formally delivered by Sohu.com Inc. following the signing of the agreement. The new edition provides richer Olympic-related content, including preparations for

the 2008 Games, and an attractive layout for the on-line community. BOCOG Executive Vice-President Jiang Xiaoyu unveiled the new website www.beijing2008.com on 7 November.

BOCOG and the **State Post Bureau of China** signed an agreement concerning special authorisation for issuing and selling 2008 Olympic Games commemorative stamps. This marked the formal launch of the philately programme.

* 2012 London

Led by Coordination Commission Chairman Denis Oswald, an IOC delegation visited London last week for a two-day London 2012 Orientation Seminar hosted by the Organising Committee for the Games of the XXX Olympiad - London 2012 (LOCOG). This type of Seminar is an integral part of the IOC's transfer of knowledge programmes but it was the first time that such a seminar had been held for a Summer Games Organising Committee. The aim of the London 2012 Orientation Seminar was to provide key guidance for the early part of LOCOG's work.

International Sport issues

* IPC / Paralympic

On 20 November in Beijing (CHN), the IPC General Assembly re-elected Sir Philip Craven (GBR) President for a further 4-year term. Former Secretary General Miguel Sagarra (ESP) was elected Vice-President. The General Assembly was the largest to date, with more than 300 participants from 90 National Paralympic Committees, 5 regions, 4 IOSDs (International Organisations for the Disabled) and 24 sports.

* WADA

On 21 November, the WADA Foundation Board selected Madrid (ESP) to host the **3rd World Conference on Doping in Sport** in November 2007. The Foundation Board also unanimously renewed the membership of WADA's Executive Board for 2006. With regard to Foundation Board membership changes, Korea will retire its seat and will be replaced by Jordan as the Asian representative. Finland will also join the Board as part of the troika system from European governments.

WADA announced the official launch of **ADAMS (Anti-Doping Administration & Management System)**, the web-based database management system that coordinates anti-doping activities worldwide under the World Anti-Doping Code. With ADAMS in place, all parties involved in anti-doping activities are now able to coordinate information



within one secure system. The four modules making up ADAMS are integral to the global anti-doping system: Athlete Whereabouts, Doping Control Platform, Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE) Management and Information Clearing House. ADAMS first went online in mid-2005 for the initial pilot phase. The system has since been introduced to 30 ADOs and 10 anti-doping laboratories with extensive training. Over the coming months, more partners will be trained and added to the ADAMS system, with a vision of bringing 85 ADOs and all anti-doping laboratories online in 2006.

WADA has appointed Switzerland's Jean-Pierre Moser as **Director for International Federations**. He will also manage the European regional office, situated in Lausanne. Mr Moser will take up his new position with WADA at the beginning of 2006.

* ASOIF

The ASOIF Forum on Development took place in Lausanne on 31 October - 1 November. ASOIF reports that the feedback from the participating IFs was very positive. 23 Summer Olympic IFs, including UIPM, were represented as well as representatives from 2 Winter Olympic IFs (WCF and IBU), the IOC Sports Department, Olympic Solidarity and the United Nations. ASOIF will prepare a synopsis of the Forum for distribution to all the ASOIF Members and the participants. The success of this event is confirmation that this form of knowledge sharing forum between the IFs is useful and valuable and has encouraged ASOIF to move forward with plans for other similar events in the future.



UIPM

On 1st November, UIPM President Klaus Schormann met with Mr Horst Werner Poppe and Mr Lutz Laemmerhold from Lufthansa at Frankfurt Airport to sign the confirmation of the agreement between UIPM and Lufthansa until 2008.

In his capacity as President of the German MP Federation, President Klaus Schormann chaired the meeting of the Executive Board and DVMF Council, which took place in Darmstadt on 4-5 November, where they decided the budget and the sport programme for 2006. Discussions also included the preparations for the 2007 Senior World Championships that will take place in Berlin, 14-22 August 2007, youth development projects and courses for judges and referees.

President Klaus Schormann was in Nairobi, Kenya from 9-13 November where he attended the IOC

Sport and Environment Conference from 9-11 November. During his stay, the President discussed with IOC member Pál Schmitt the importance of sport and the environment, informing him that UIPM will in the near future change from air pistol to laser pistol shooting to ensure better security and protection of the environment. They also spoke about the excellent sport body World Olympians Association of which UIPM Secretary General Joel Bouzou is Treasurer and Pál Schmitt is the President.

With Dr Klaus Töpfer, Under Secretary General for the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP), the UIPM President spoke about the needs of this World Forum especially for less developed countries. Sport can always be a big help to educate young people to take better care of their environment.

President Klaus Schormann met Tegla Loroupe, long distance runner, former marathon world record holder, and President of the Tegla Loroupe Peace Foundation and they discussed possibilities for UIPM to partner her foundation.

On 12 November, the UIPM President had a meeting with Peter Nderitu; President of the Kenyan MP Federation and NOC Vice President to discuss steps for Modern Pentathlon through Biathlon, including school involvement with cooperation between national and international schools. As a start, President Klaus Schormann spoke with Klaus Tegtmeier from the Michael Grzimek School located in Nairobi,

The President took the opportunity of a visit to Monaco for a function hosted by the International German Club of Monaco (CAI) to visit the UIPM Headquarters on 21 November for a brief meeting with Secretary General Joël Bouzou. In his capacity as CAI Vice president he also attended the same day an audience given by UIPM Honorary President Prince Albert II of Monaco at his residence to the CAI Executive Board members.

On the 28th November, President Klaus Schormann took part in the 20th Anniversary celebrations of the Sport Medical Institute of Frankfurt, which were organised at the Kranichstein Hunting Lodge in Darmstadt. The UIPM President was one of the founders of the Institute.

2006 World Championships

President Klaus Schormann and Secretary General Joël Bouzou visited Guatemala from 22-27 November in order to review the preparation of the 2006 World Championships to be held on 15-22 November 2006. They were joined on 24 November



by John Helmick, UIPM Vice President for Business Affairs. The preparations for the site visit were excellently managed by Mrs Maria Isabel Luna de Sanz-Agero, President of the Guatemalan Modern Pentathlon Federation and Mrs Annica Kepfer de Valls, Vice President.

On the 1st day of their visit, President Schormann and Secretary General Bouzou visited the Olympic Solidarity course being conducted by Christian Roudaut from France. Coaches from neighbouring countries such as El Salvador, Cuba and Panama, also attended the course. Following a meeting with the President of the Sport Confederation, Mr Oswaldo Mendez Herbruger, they met with the Mayor of Guatemala City Mr Alvaro Arzu, who assured the Organising Committee of his full support. In the evening, a meeting was arranged with Mr Willi Kaltschmitt, IOC Member and Minister of Tourism, and with NOC President Dr Fernando Beltranena Valladares

On the 2nd day, the President and Secretary General accompanied by Willi Kaltschmitt and National Federation leaders met with Mr Oscar Berger, President of the Republic of Guatemala. Mr Berger declared that the 2006 Modern Pentathlon World Championships were a very important event for Guatemala in 2006 and that he will give his strongest support as Honorary President of the Organising Committee. They also attended a Press conference where they were joined by Director of National Guatemala Tourism Office Mr Daniel Mooney.

On the last day, the UIPM delegation and Organising Committee inspected the competition venue, which will be the Escola Nacional de Physical Education in Naranjo, led by its Director Mr Jorge L. Zamora. For the 2006 World Championships, a "Pentathlon Village" will be created, all five events being organised in a 150m radius, including a 50m pool and only twelve minutes from the UIPM family hotel.

Results

New Balance Pentathlon World Ranking

The final New Balance Pentathlon World Rankings for 2005 will be announced officially at the UIPM Congress 16-18 December, but it confirms **Zsuzsanna Vörös** (HUN) and **Eric Walther** (GER) as the top ranked pentathletes in the world this year. The two world leaders will also enjoy receiving prize money as part of the contract with UIPM's sponsor New Balance Athletic shoe Inc. Prize money is awarded to the top 5 in the World Ranking at the end of each year, and this year the amounts have been slightly increased for an overall award of USD 30,000 shared amongst the 5 men and 5 women athletes.
