IOC

More than 700 delegates representing the International Olympic Committee, athletes, International Federations, National Olympic Committees and Continental Associations, educational institutions, governmental and non-governmental organisations as well as various UN specialized agencies, met in Beijing from 22-24 October for the **5th World Forum on Sport, Olympic Education and Culture** organised by the IOC Commission for Culture and Olympic Education with cooperation of the Beijing 2008 Organising Committee and the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organisation (UNESCO). Under the theme "Sport and a world of harmony: the role of Olympic education and culture" various presentations were made in plenary and specialized break-out sessions. IOC President Jacques Rogge delivered a keynote speech at the opening ceremony. The two-day Forum resulted in a unanimous declaration to move forward in encouraging making universal ethical values education a preoccupation and promoting physical education and sport so that it assumes a primary place in educational systems. The Forum also agreed to encourage the members of the Olympic Movement to participate in educational and cultural activities including Olympic art, literature and photography contests and to promote Olympic youth

camps and traditional games and to attach more attention to physical activity and to persons with disabilities and in disadvantaged communities. UIPM President **Klaus Schormann** member of the IOC Commission for Culture and Olympic Education attended both the Forum and the Commission meeting which was held just prior to the event, and UIPM Vice President **Kui-Sung Choi** represented UIPM at the Forum.

*IOC Commission for Culture and Olympic Education

During the Commission's meeting, UIPM President Klaus Schormann, as Chair of the Commission's working Group, gave some very important recommendations:

- priority to Olympic Youth camp – to be re-established in the Olympic Charter
- to study contest for photography and short film and a contest for music and sport
- to give athletes as they arrive in the Olympic Village a CD with information on the culture and traditions of the host country and to construct a public viewing site in the Village
- to establish an information stand at the annual International Bookfair in Frankfurt.

*NOCs

The **ANOC Working Group** consisting of two representatives from each continent and chaired by



ANOC Secretary General Ms. Gunilla Lindberg met at the ANOC offices in Paris on 7-8 October. The main topics on the agenda were the debriefing of the Torino Games, the qualification system for Beijing 2008, the accreditation system for 2008, the Technical Manual on Olympic Village, and topics of concern from the NOCs to be discussed at the IOC Coordination Commission in Beijing on 24-26 October. The Working Group also discussed rules for athletes image, marketing rights of the NOCs and guidelines for uniforms for the Games in Beijing. The Working Group also reviewed the latest information from the OCOGs in Vancouver and London. The report from the Working Group will be discussed at the ANOC Executive Council meeting in Kuwait on 26th November.

* 2008 Beijing

The **IOC Coordination Commission** for the Beijing 2008 Olympic Games held its seventh plenary session in Beijing on 24-26 October. Discussions focused on subjects such as venue operations, project construction and the environment, security, human resources, transportation, education and culture, image and marks, legacy, media and communications, Paralympics, competition schedule, co-host cities, and ticketing. The IOC also announced that, as part of its zero tolerance approach to fighting doping, the number of tests will be significantly increased. Final numbers are to be confirmed, but are expected to be around 4,500, a 25 per cent increase on Athens 2004. The IOC also confirmed that the IOC Executive Board has agreed to the competition schedule for the Beijing Games.

IOC **President Jacques Rogge** met with the Chinese Prime Minister, Wen Jiabao on 25 October, having visited the previous day the Olympic Venues of the National Stadium, also known as the "Bird's Nest", and the National Aquatics Centre or "Water Cube". During the meeting, the IOC President discussed with Prime Minister Wen a wide range of topics relating to the preparation of the Games in Beijing and the development of sport in China.

The **7th World Conference on Sport and Environment** will be held in Beijing in October 2007. BOCOG President Liu Qi and IOC President Jacques Rogge signed the MOU on behalf of their respective organizations. The conference, jointly organized by IOC Sport and Environment Commission and UNEP (United Nations Environment Program), is held once in two years, with the participation of some 500 people from IOC, United Nations, World Health Organisation, IPC, NOCs, organising committees of Olympic Games, IFs and representatives of a number of international enterprises involved in environmental protection.

* 2012 London

An **IOC delegation** headed by the Chairman of the IOC Coordination Commission for the 2012 Games, Denis Oswald, paid a one-day visit to the city on Wednesday to review the Olympic project. The IOC group, composed of members of the IOC administration and experts, was informed of the progress made by the Organising Committee since the Commission last visited in April this year.



International Sport

* SPORTEL Monaco 2006

A record of 2117 participants representing 932 companies from 67 countries worldwide, took part in SPORTEL Monaco 2006, making it the largest SPORTEL event ever. An expanded exhibition floor featured 156 stands and exhibits representing a 33% increase over the 115 stands and exhibits in 2005. The International Sports, Television and New Media Convention focused on new technology 'High Definition Television' and 'TV on Mobile Screens'. Inaugurated by HSH Prince Albert II, UIPM Honorary President, the convention welcomed an important number of personalities including, Gerhard Heiberg Chairman, IOC Marketing Commission; Alex Gilady IOC Member; Binyuan Yang Head of Broadcast Division, Media Operations, Beijing 2008; Sebastian Coe Chairman of London 2012.

UIPM Secretary General **Joël Bouzou** attended in his dual capacity as UIPM Secretary General and Advisor to HSH Prince Albert II of Monaco. He took part in the Forum and had various meetings:- Eurovision to summarise 2006 and to discuss future Modern Pentathlon broadcasts for 2007; GAISF General Director Christine Dominguez; ASOIF Director Andrew Ryan; Carat Sport President George Vanderschmitt. He also had exchanges with the International Archery Federation about television strategy and met with IOC Members Guy Drut and Alex Gilady.

Biennale Sport Sciences, Monaco 2007 - IOC Medical Commission

On 13 October, a meeting was organised in Monaco in preparation of the Biennale Sport Sciences which will be organised in September 2007 for the first time in Monaco. This forum will promote sport as a solution against human inactivity which is growing in modern society and represents a danger for the health of the young generations. Dr Patrick Schamasch led the meeting for the IOC Medical Commission. Pr Fabio Pigozzi attended as member of the IOC Medical Commission and Joël Bouzou in his two capacities.

WADA announced the availability of the **2007 list of prohibited substances and methods**, approved on 16 September by its Executive Committee. The list will go into effect on 1 January 2007. UIPM President's activities in Germany

On 6 October, President Klaus Schormann met with IOC Executive Board member Dr Thomas Bach on the occasion of the Hesse Sports Association General Assembly in Frankfurt and they spoke about the forthcoming Asian Games in Doha and the autonomy of sport in conflict with the E.U.

On 9 October President Klaus Schormann attended the 6th Round Table on Sport in Frankfurt, together with Dieter Kühnle (UIPM Ad Hoc commission member and Olympic Management consultant on External Affairs and Public Policy). The topic was 'Sport as a motor for politics, business and media.' Main speakers were Wolfgang Niesbach, VP of FIFA World Cup 2006, Werner D'Inka, publisher of the Frankfurter Allgemeine and Dr Ulrich Kater, chief economist of the Deka-Bank.

On 10-11 October, President Klaus Schormann visited Munich where he had meetings with representatives of Siemens and Bogner. He attended also a ceremony for Helene and Georg Urban (Treasurer and President of MP Bavaria) on being awarded the 'Bundesverdienstkreuz am Bande' signed by the State President Dr Horst Köhler. President Schormann also met with HRH Prince Leopold of Bavaria who is the Patron of MP in Bavaria to discuss with him business cooperation and activities in Monaco.

President Klaus Schormann attended the International German Open Championships for Men in Potsdam on 15 October where he discussed possibilities for future cooperation with President of MP Brandenburg Ralf Marschall (also President of Potsdam Police) and Dr Rainer Raack, owner of the equestrian centre in Grossbeeren/ Potsdam.

The following day he met with Pr.Dr. Holger Preuss (member UIPM Ad Hoc Commission) in Frankfurt to discuss future strategies for UIPM business affairs linked to the new competition formats of Modern Pentathlon.

UIPM President's activities in Beijing

On 19 October, the UIPM President flew to Beijing for his duties as member of the IOC Commission for Culture and Olympic Education. On 20 October, President Klaus Schormann, accompanied by Vice President Kui-Sung Choi, had a working dinner in Xi'an with the governors of Shaanxi Province to discuss the founding of a new MP centre in 2007. Chinese MP Association (CMPA) Vice President Xu Heifeng was also notably present – Mr Heifeng won China's first ever Olympic Gold medal, 1984 in free pistol shooting. Earlier in the day, the President had a lunch together with all the top-level athletes of the CMPA at the training centre in Beijing.

During the IOC Forum, the UIPM President met with IOC members, NOC Presidents and many other international delegates. With IOC member Carlos Nuzman (Brazil) he discussed the Pan American Games, the new MP Centre and future international Championships for MP in Rio de Janeiro, where a Regional Training Centre and Academy for South America could be based.

On 25 October, at a working dinner, President Klaus Schormann and Vice President Kui-Sung Choi were briefed by CMPA President Jiadong Cai, Secretary General Zhang Bin and Vice President Hu Heifeng on the new training complex for MP located at the Sports University, where all five discipline will be in one place; it will be the biggest MP Centre in the world. VP Choi visited the facilities on 27 October and was suitably impressed by the technology (shooting/fencing) and the size of the centre.

Secretary General Joël Bouzou attended the World Fencing Championships in Turin on 9 October where he was able to see first hand the new system of video-assisted refereeing and meet with FIE President René Roch.

Executive Board Meeting, 5-6 October, Berlin

The UIPM held its Executive Board meeting in Berlin, Germany on 05-06 October. President Klaus Schormann and Secretary General Joël Bouzou led the meeting which focused on preparation of the forthcoming Congress and overall review of the goals set for the coming years.

Notable amongst the many decisions made by the EB was the awarding of host city venues, and in particular, the 2009 edition of the Senior World Championships to the Modern Pentathlon Association of Great Britain (MPAGB), which will be held at Crystal Palace in London and Copenhagen will host the 2009 UIPM Congress. Other host city venues were decided for World Cups and World Championships in until 2009:

The Executive Board also received activity reports from UIPM Committees as well as two proposals from the Medical Committee regarding motions to change rules on out of competition testing and alcohol testing to be put to the UIPM Congress being held in Kyoto, Japan on 16-17 December 2006. In terms of Continental Development, the Presidents of the Continental Confederations reported on their development plans for the continual expansion of Modern Pentathlon in their respective areas.

In particular, the UIPM Executive Board approved the membership application of the **Fédération Nationale Ivoirienne de Pentathlon Moderne** and will propose to Congress to accept them as UIPM member with full rights and obligations.

On 6 October, the EB members toured the **Berlin Olympic Stadium Complex**, venue of next year's Senior World Championships taking place 14-22 August. This was followed by a Ceremony at Olympic Park to raise the UIPM Flag which will stay hoisted until the Championships are over.

The next meeting of the UIPM Executive Board will take place on 15 December in Kyoto, preceding the UIPM Congress.

Seminar for Competition Organisers, Kyoto

A UIPM Seminar for Competition Organisers will be held in Kyoto, Japan on the occasion of the UIPM Congress. The Seminar will take place in the afternoon of **15 December** at the Rihga Royal Hotel

(UIPM Congress and Accommodation venue). Led by Vice President for Business Affairs John Helmick, Sports Director Mauro Tirinnanzi and Medical Committee Chair Pr Fabio Pigozzi, the 4-hour Seminar will cover topics such as Infrastructure, finance, LOC obligations, UIPM services, media, marketing, technical matters, competition venues, results, officials, medical matters, doping controls, medical services, nutrition for the athletes.

South American Championships, Resende BRA

Held in Resende, Rio de Janeiro – Brazil, the South American Championships, took place from 6–9 October. The Women's Final took place on the rainy 7th Oct and the Men's Final on also a rainy 8th Oct. It was a classifying competition for the XV Pan American Games – Rio 2007.

During the first day of Competition, the Women's Final, Gabriela Raute (ARG), took the first 1st place in the shooting; the winner of the fencing and the swimming Events was Yane Marques (BRA). Gabriela Raute got herself another 1st place in the Riding Event. Yane Marques crossed the finish line in 1st place and was quickly followed by Larissa Lellys (BRA) and then by Clarisse Menezes (BRA). With this victory, **Yane Marques** conquered for the third time the 1st place of a South American Championships. Crossing the finish line in 4th place, Priscila Oliveira (BRA) was the winner of the Junior Women's Final.

On the 8th Oct, the Men's Final, the shooting Event was won by the pentathlete Fabio Carrara (BRA) and the fencing event by Daniel Santos (BRA). The swimming event presented Eduardo Salas (VEN) as its winner. Mcdonell Maieron (BRA) won the riding Event. Winning the Men's Final **Daniel Santos** shared the podium with Wagner Romão (BRA), 2nd place, and José Guitian (PAN), 3rd place and winner of the running event. In the 5th place of the Senior Men's Final, Michael Cunningham (BRA) was the winner of the Junior Men's Final.

Considering the results of the Teams in both gender, Brazil got 1st place and Argentina 2nd. The total of participants in the Competition was 34 athletes representing Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Panama and Venezuela.

During the same week, the **South American Congress 2006** was held in the presence of the President of the South American Federation Mr. José Luis Rodriguez, of the President of the host Federation Mr. Helio Meirelles and Officials of other South American Federations.

Australia

Great Britain

The Modern Pentathlon Association of Great Britain is holding a press conference and photocall on Friday 3 November 2006 at the Sports Training Village, University of Bath, prior to the Team's departure for the Modern Pentathlon World Championships in Guatemala. Mhairi Spence and Georgina Harland have also agreed to take part in a pistol shooting competition against members of the media. Journalists wishing to take part will be given expert coaching from members of the Modern Pentathlon Association.

Hungary

Olympic athletes, officials and representatives of the media, who took part in or covered the events of the Olympic Games 70, 50, 30 or 10 years ago, held a special reunion at the training camp in Tata, Hungary on 14 October. More than 500 attendees were welcomed by an orchestra and folk dancers. Former team mates, Olympians, heroes and 85 medallists were reunited. The Olympic Flame was lit, the Olympic hymn was played and the Hungarian Olympic Committee (HOC) President Pál Schmitt, delivered a speech in which he talked about the fact that Olympic ideals means having a special outlook on life. The aim is to further development, strengthen solidarity, follow the rules of fair play and to help bring peace. At the conclusion of the event,

films of the Berlin, Melbourne, Montreal and Atlanta Olympic Games were shown. Modern Pentathlon Olympic medallists that attended the event were Montreal 1972 Bronze team *Tamás Kancsai, Tibor Maracskó, Szvetisláv Sasics* and 1996 Atlanta Bronze Individual *János Martinek*.

USA

The 2006 U.S. Open and Senior Modern Pentathlon National Championships were held last weekend, October 28-29, in Colorado Springs. Besides determining the U.S. National Modern Pentathlon Champion, the event also had an international flair with athletes representing six countries (Canada, Dominican Republic, Egypt, Latvia, Ukraine and the United States) competing for the title of U.S. Open Champion. The competition took place in two separate venues: the United States Olympic Complex for shooting, fencing and swimming and the running and riding were contested at the Norris-Penrose Events Center (*from USOC Press release.*)

On the women's side, Shelia Taormina won the Gold Medal after a very close match with Omnia Fakhry from Egypt. The competition was decided during riding, the last event, when the leader Fakhry had two refusals on the last jump. On the men's side, the competition was won by Eli Bremer who after a strong run was leading before the last event. Eli had only one knock down, so he was secured to win the nationals no matter what the outcome. The second place was taken by Nicolae Diaconescu and Dennis Bowsher won third. Congratulations to all. Dragomir Cioroslan was an excellent competition director and all went smooth.
