### IOC

This week the **IOC Press Commission** held for the first time its annual meeting in Beijing. On the agenda was the study of a report on the progress of preparations as regards media operations by the 2008 Games Organising Committee (BOCOG) as well media services to be provided during the Games.

On 13 September at the Olympic Museum in Lausanne, **the IOC Medical Commission** held its annual meeting with the chairs of the medical commissions of the Olympic International Federations. This forum enables the IFs to exchange their points of view on particular problems which arise within their own sports, learn about problems affecting other sports and thereby identify points of common interest. **Pr Fabio Pigozzi was present as Chairman of UIPM's Medical Committee.**

### \* NOCs

This month in Mexico City, an Olympic Solidarity Continental Seminar brought together representatives of the 42 NOCs belonging to the **Pan- American Sports Organisation (PASO)**. The main purpose was to review the programmes

offered by OS during the 2005-2008 period, assess the results so far, perform an intermediate assessment and decide on measures to improve these results, particularly regarding technical and financial monitoring and the execution of the programmes.

### \* 2008 Beijing

This week, over 200 editors and journalists representing the written press took part in the **First World Press Briefing in Beijing**. Organised by BOCOG and supported by the IOC, this meeting focused mainly on media operations for Games time such as accommodation and transportation. It was also an opportunity for BOCOG to give the media updates on Games preparations as well as outlining the range of services available to them at Games time. Participants were able to visit the Olympic facilities, including the National Stadium. On 24 September in Beijing, an agreement on **photo services** at the 2008 Games was signed by the IOC, BOCOG and three international agencies: Associated Press, Reuters and Agence France Presse. With this agreement, the International Olympic Photo Pool (IOPP) has been officially created, its main aim being to provide a sufficient



number of professional photographers for the Games ceremonies, competitions and all other Games related activities.

BOCOG and the government of the Special Administrative Region (SAR) of Hong Kong formally signed the "**Arrangements on the Equestrian Competition** of the Beijing Olympic Games between BOCOG and the Hong Kong SAR". The Olympic equestrian competition will be held from 9 to 20 August 2008 in Hong Kong.



### International Sport

IOC President Jacques Rogge led the **first seminar on the Autonomy of the Olympic and Sports Movement** held on 21 and 22 September at the Olympic Museum in Lausanne. He was helped in his task by the seminar's vice-presidents, Mario Vázquez Raña (ANOC), Els van Breda Vriesman (ASOIF) and René Fasel (AIOWF) and this in the presence of IOC Honorary President Juan Antonio Samaranch, who is also UIPM Honorary Life member. During these two days, the participants (IOC members, and Presidents of International Federations and National Olympic Committees) addressed the three following themes: basic principles for maintaining the autonomy of the structures of the Olympic and sports movement; analysis of the current situation; evaluation and analysis of the questions and risks of interference; relations with public authorities and governmental bodies; and estimation of the capacity of the Olympic and sports movement to warn about and react to any interference. **UIPM President Klaus Schormann and Secretary General Joël Bouzou attended the Seminar and the UIPM President gave a speech** during the morning of Day 2 of the Seminar under the Theme "first overview of the capacity of the Olympic and international sports movement to prevent and react to disputes and interference from outside".

The **International Boxing Association (AIBA)** officially inaugurated its new headquarters located in the House of International Sport in Lausanne. Its address is now: Avenue de Rhodanie 54, 1007 Lausanne.



### UIPM

In Frankfurt/Main, on 4 September, UIPM President Klaus Schormann met with IOC Vice President Thomas Bach and they discussed the interdependence of sport and the autonomy of sport with regard to the fight against doping and that the

State and politics should not interfere in the sport rules and regulations.

**Secretary General Joël Bouzou received from French Sports Minister Jean-Francois Lamour his Legion of Honour medal**, awarded to him last year, at a special ceremony in Condom on 9 September. Also present were **UIPM Honorary President Prince Albert II of Monaco** and **UIPM President Klaus Schormann and EB Member for Development Timur Dossymbetov**. Joël Bouzou received the Legion of Honour award in the Chevalier class for his valuable contribution to sport in France. He served as Director of the French Federation between 1993 and 1997, as well as founding *Rassemblement Par le Sport* ("Together Through Sport") in 1991. The Legion of Honour is one of France's most prestigious awards and is the highest honour given to civilians. On this occasion also, Jean-François Lamour, Klaus Schormann and Timur Dossymbetov became Musketeers, an organisation which follows the principle of D'Artagnan, served Louis XIV as captain of musketeers.

**President of the South American MP Confederation, José Rodriguez, has been appointed member of the Teaching and Culture Commission of the Olympic Committee of Chile.** The programme includes the following areas – Teaching, Olympic Academy, Sports Museum and Library, Sports for All, Volunteers, Sports and Culture. The Commission was created as a Consulting and Academic Institution and comprises six active members who were chosen for their known national sports path in Chile. UIPM sends congratulations to José Rodriguez on his appointment and wishes success in the Commission's projects.

**UIPM Athletes' Committee member Kate Allenby was re-elected Chair of the British Athletes' Commission Executive Committee** at their annual conference earlier this month. In all, competitors from 40 sports, including summer and winter Olympic, Paralympic and World Class-funded, were represented at BAC's conference. UIPM congratulates Kate Allenby on her re-election and wishes her continued success.

### World Cup #5, Cairo (EGY) 13-18 September

Attended by UIPM President Klaus Schormann, the first World Cup ever to be staged in Africa was a great success in terms of organisation, marketing and media, as well as athlete participation and results. During his visit, the UIPM President,



together with the President of the Egyptian MP Federation (ECMP) Ahmed Nasser, twice gave one-hour long live interviews on national television about the development of Modern Pentathlon in Egypt and Africa with the view to future World Cups, World Championships and Biathle events being staged in Cairo in the years leading to 2012.

On 4 September, President Klaus Schormann had dinner together with **Dr Hassan Moustafa, IHF President and Dr Rania Elwani, IOC member** where they had discussions about activities from WADA with IFs and the co-operation between IFs in general matter of sport and future duties of ASOIF.

With the **Police Department**, General (Police) Sheref Gomaah, Vice Interior Minister/President of thematic Police, General (Police) Mohamed Sobeih Foadh Vice Interior Minister/President of Police Sports Union and General (Police) Mohamoud Salah Vice President of Police Sports Union, President Klaus Schormann discussed the possibilities of a very strong and fruitful co-operation between Modern Pentathlon and the Police based on educational projects through Modern Pentathlon. The athletes serving in the Police are an important pillar under the roof of UIPM, which is also seen in Italy, Japan, etc.

President Klaus Schormann took part in the 2<sup>nd</sup> meeting of the **Pan Arab Confederation** at Mina House Obroi on 14 September, which was held under the Chairmanship of ECMP President Ahmed Nasser. A very stimulating discussion followed the presentation and Modern Pentathlon will have in the near future new developing countries in the Arabic region.

On 17 September, the UIPM President met with Minister Engineer. Hassan Sakr, **President Egyptian Sports Council**, where they exchanged ideas about education through sport and the social role of sport in the present society. The minister underlined his strong support for Modern Pentathlon in Egypt based on their excellent performance in the last years.

On 18 September, President Klaus Schormann met briefly with **NOC President and IOC member General Mounir Sabet** at his home to speak with him about the 5th IOC World Forum on Sport, Education and Culture being held in Beijing 22-24 October.

Also during the World Cup in Cairo, President Klaus Schormann, together with **African Confederation President Sameh Guemeih**, met with the President of the newly established **Ivory Coast Modern Pentathlon Federation**, Mr François-Xavier Akonde and Vice President Mrs Adjarata Diarossouba.

On 19 September, President Klaus Schormann represented UIPM and DOSB at a reception given by the Frankfurt City Government for NOC President and Secretary Generals from the French speaking African countries. The President had a very constructive discussion with **NOC President Mustafa Berraf of Algeria** who is willing to help develop Modern Pentathlon in the northern countries of Africa.

On 23 September, President Klaus Schormann gave a speech at the **50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Modern Pentathlon in Brandenburg** in the City of Potsdam. In the former German Democratic Republic (DDR), Modern Pentathlon was, until 1968, a highly developed Olympic Sport and in Potsdam was one of the main training centres of the DDR.

On 24-25 September, the UIPM President met with members of the Berlin Senate, the President of the Berlin Sport Association Peter Hanisch and the President of the Organising Committee of the **2007 Modern Pentathlon World Championships**, Christian Frieden to discuss duties and responsibilities of the City of Berlin and the Berlin Sport society. On 6 October, the UIPM Executive Board will hoist the UIPM Flag at the Olympic Park during the time of the Executive Board meeting (5-6 October).

#### **World Cup #6, 19-24 September & World Cup Final, 27-28 September, Chianciano, (ITA)**

The Italian MP Federation had a busy time recently, hosting the World Youth A Championships last month and the World Cup #6 a fortnight ago, when they agreed to step in at the last minute to stage also the World Cup Final last week. UIPM thanks them for this gesture and everyone appreciated the work that must have gone on to conduct such an important event. UIPM Sports Director Mauro Tirinnanzi and FIPM Secretary General Sylvia Loporchio spent time and energy contacting by phone all the confirmed participants of the Final and the reserves, and thanks must go to them and the Federations and athletes also for their cooperation in responding and reacting so quickly to the invitations.

For the Award Ceremonies, dignitaries present were Chianciano City Mayor Guido Bombogli, Executive Board (EB) member for Sport Chianciano City Claudio Rossi, EB Member for Sport Sarteano City Rita Toccacelli, Italian MP Federation (FIPM) President Lucio Felicita, FIPM Vice President Angelo Maccaroni, FIPM EB member Giorgio Vigili, UIPM President Klaus Schormann, UIPM Secretary

#### World Cup Final Men

The shooting was won by **LEE Choon-Huan** of Korea with 1204 MP points, 189 target points. World Champion 2005 from China **Qian Zhenhua** was 2nd with 1192 MP points, 188 target points but took over the lead after two events thanks to his 2nd place also in the Fence, which was won by **Sandris Sika** of Latvia thanks to one victory more.

At the Swim, all eyes were on Egyptian **Amro El Geziry** as the current world record holder for EP swim. Despite powering through the laps he only came close to breaking the record finishing in 1:55.53. Three other athletes swam sub 2 minutes.

At the start of the ride, Qian Zhenhua was still in the lead, Viktor Horvath (HUN) in 2nd place and Libor Capalini in 3rd. A high level obstacle course, good quality horses and not one athlete was able to achieve the perfect score. **John Zakrzewski** of France scored the highest with a clear round and a time penalty for 1192 MP points.

**Libor Capalini** took first place after 4 events, but with only a one second start ahead of Sandris Sika. Over the 3000m course he maintained his lead across the finish line in Gold medal place, to win his first ever World Cup Final. Until the last lap, **Sandris Sika** held on to 2nd place but was overtaken at the last lap by Viktor Horvath and had to settle for Bronze, whilst **Viktor Horvath** took the Silver. The fastest run was by Denis Cherkovskis in 9 minutes 25 seconds.

#### Women's Final

Canada's **Monica Pinette** took an early lead winning the Shoot with an excellent 189 target points, to give her 1204 MP points. Amelie Cazé (FRA) had what was probably her worst Shoot ever, but made up for it somewhat with a joint second place in the Fence with 22 victories. But the outright winner of the discipline was **LIU Xhou** (CHN) – 25 victories against 6 defeats for 1084 MP points, giving her 1<sup>st</sup> place after 2 events, with Pinette in 2<sup>nd</sup>

It was no surprise that 2004 World Triathlon Champion and Olympic medal swimmer **Sheila Taormina (USA)** won the swim event – her time 2:06.67 gave her 1400 MP points exactly. Behind her, the next fastest was Amelie Cazé at 2:12.01 for 1336 MP points. Liu Zhou still led after 3 events and with a 112 MP point advantage over Omnia Fakhry (EGY) who moved up to 2<sup>nd</sup> place.

There were good rides from nearly all the athletes but Omnia Fakhry was not so successful round the course and dropped to below midway point. The only perfect round for 1200 points in the competition

came from **Axelle Guiget** of France, though Anastasia Samusevich (BLR) achieved a clear round with time penalties. Nevertheless, **Liu Zhou** was able to extend her lead at the top to 132 points which gave her a 33 second head start in the Run, ahead of **Sylwia Czwojdzinska** (POL) and her team mate **Xiu Xiu** both in 2<sup>nd</sup> place after 4 events, whilst Monica Pinette and Elen Rublevska (LAT) were tied at 3<sup>rd</sup> and over 40 seconds behind the leader.

However, Liu Zhou was only able to sustain her lead until the last lap, whilst **Italy's own Alessia Pieretti**, starting out in 6<sup>th</sup> place, steadily advanced her way up to 1<sup>st</sup> place at the turn into the final lap and straight across the Finish line for her first world title and Gold ! Impressive performances also from **Anastasia Samusevich and Paulina Boenisz** (POL), starting out in 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> places respectively, ran the same time, the second fastest of the course, and came in 2<sup>nd</sup> place and 3<sup>rd</sup> respectively. The fastest run, not surprisingly, was from Sheila Taormina who completed the 3000m road course in 10:25.60.

#### World Biathle Championships 2006

Well established as a venue for world class sporting events, Salford (GBR), hosted the World Biathle Championships on Sunday 3 September.

The course was set against the iconic backdrop of Salford Quays and the swim took place in the Ontario Basin. The event, co-hosted by the Modern Pentathlon Association of Great Britain (MPAGB) and Salford City Council saw 300 athletes from 14 countries converge on the Salford Quays. Prior to the event, Leader of Salford City Council, Cllr John Merry said: "It is an honour to host an event of this calibre in our city. The World Biathle Championships promises to be an exciting showcase of some of the world's most talented athletes and will be a great spectator experience."

From UIPM, President Klaus Schormann and Secretary General Joël Bouzou attended the competition as did Martin Dawe, EB Member for Marketing, who acted as Marketing Delegate. Joël Bouzou was also Technical Delegate. From MPAGB, Chairman Tony Temple Q.C. and Chief Executive Peter Hart were both in Salford for these important World Championships.

Saturday 2 September was for athlete registration and the pre-event Pasta Party was held at the Imperial War Museum.

The wet and windy conditions on competition day itself were quite dreadful, particularly during the afternoon races. Nevertheless, only a couple of athletes did not finish their race.

Highlights of the World Championships were broadcast on local television that evening, which



was seen by many of the participants prior to leaving their hotels for the Closing party, which was held at Manchester United's Old Trafford Stadium.

**Senior Men** (22 years and over) – Gregan Clarkson (GBR) won his first World Championships Gold Medal and managed this feat in his home country. The Junior medallist (Silver 2001 and Bronze 2003) who came 8<sup>th</sup> in his first Senior World Championship competition last year in Monaco, was 5<sup>th</sup> fastest in the first Run but first out of the water and from then on, he led the pack to finish a good 6 seconds ahead of South Africa's Christopher Lionett.

**Senior Women** (22 years and over) – It was a British one two three as last year's World Junior Champion Maria Bennett took Gold with a straight forward win in her first Senior World Championship competition, at the same time beating former World Champion and multiple silver medallist Rachel Jones into 3<sup>rd</sup> place. Caroline Jones (no relation) came second.

**Juniors** (19-21 years) – Great Britain dominated both the Men's and the Women races taking all the medal positions except for Junior Men Bronze. James Lock, Silver medallist in 2004 and Bronze medallist last year, this time took top podium position coming in 12 seconds ahead of Chris Wilson. Harriet Hart, bronze medallist in 2004, improved on this best place to take Gold thanks to her faster swim, which even beat the Senior Ladies.



#### **World Masters Championship - a great success in Usti nad Labem (CZE), 6 -10 September**

"MORE than 50 athletes from 15 countries recently competed in the World Championships for Modern Pentathlon Masters earlier this month. The U.S. boasted a pair of competitors, Donald Morley of San Antonio, Texas, and George Sanderlin of Atlanta, Ga. Morley competed in the pentathlon, which consists of shooting (10 meter air pistol) fencing (epee with one point, round-robin bouts), swimming (100 meter freestyle), riding (stadium show jumping), and running (2 kilometers). Meanwhile, Sanderlin competed in the tetrathlon, which is comprised of everything in the pentathlon except for the riding event.

In the pentathlon, Morley won the 100 meter freestyle swim in 1:04.9 for 1,108 points. His competition included many athletes who were much younger. Morley's marksmanship earned him a tie for second in the shoot with a score of 181, out of a possible 200. This effort also earned him 1,108 points. He tied for first in the ride earning 1,200 points. Morley, a former member of the U.S.

national modern pentathlon team in the 1970s, made his second appearance in the World Masters (over 40 years of age) competition. Overall, he finished ninth with 5,292 points. As a relative new-comer to the sport, Sanderlin scored a personal record 3,342 points in the tetrathlon to rank 16<sup>th</sup> in the world. He posted personal bests in both the shoot (score of 165) and the 2k run. He knocked 24 seconds off of his previous-best 2k time, finishing in 7:44.8. Sanderlin, who only started the sport 20 months ago, did not compete in the ride. "Overall, the competition was very strong," Sanderlin said. "Most of the Europeans have competed in modern pentathlon since they were 11 or 12. However, after watching the men's riding competition, I know that I can ride at that level. I am aiming to ride in the Canada Championships in Calgary next summer. In the meantime, I'll need to get into some jumping competitions to tune up."

The winning team was the CZE team who did their best on their home ground. Congratulation to Zdenek Kubec, Jan Jindra and Miroslav Vavre. Especially in riding and fencing where they made a very good team result. The Ukrainian team was 2nd and the Austrian team was 3rd.

The Women's World Championship was won by Ute Schiffmann (GER). Elke Schuller (AUT) was 2nd and Jaqueline Schreiber (SUI) was 3rd.

The Tetrathlon competition for men was won by the Estonian Eivar Veri. The women competition was won by Elisabeth Michael (GER).



In general all masters athletes did very good result and showed that they had trained and prepared themselves well for this World Championship.

All the events was very good organised together with the bus-transportations of the athletes. All the events took place within a very short range in the city and the timetable was followed nearly all the way. The celebration evenings after relay and individual/team competition was at the Interhotel Bohemia with excellent food and drinks good music and dancing.

The whole competition was taken on video. Every evening at the dinner the whole day of competition was showed on a big screen. There will soon be an official video for sale showing the highlights of the competitions so that we all can memorize the good days and the fine competition we had in USTI nad Labem.

Thank you from us all to our Czech-Masters friends. The Masters Conference was held between the relay and the individual competition on Thursday 7th where all the nations participated with two representatives. The chairman Miklos Borsa(HUN) did a good job and we came almost through the agenda before we had to start the technical meeting for the individual competition. All Nations will get a full report from the Masters Conference as soon as our secretary Christine Stalder (SUI) has finished the tough job to summarise all what was said and voted for during the meeting. Thank you for the re-election as president for the next two years. "

### **Balkan Youth Championships, 08-11 September, Athens GRE**

The first ever Balkan Youth Championships took place in Athens on 8-11 September, organised by ECMP Vice President Takis Loverdos with Katerina Romiou appointed as UIPM Technical Official for the event. Most exciting was the participation of athletes from Albania and Serbia Montenegro, joining the young pentathletes of Greece, Turkey, Romania, Bulgaria, Moldova and Cyprus for their first international competitions. 75 athletes from 8 Balkan States competed in total. UIPM thanks the initiative of the ECMP Vice President for hosting the first edition and look forward to a 2<sup>nd</sup> edition very soon that will once again unite the young athletes of the Balkan States.



### **Nations**

#### Great Britain

Jim Fox, the captain of the British Modern Pentathlon team that won Olympic gold medals in

1976, could be celebrating another victory in London 2012. King's Cross, the horse he owns with his wife Alexandra, won the Horse Trials at Gatcombe Park earlier this month. Kitty Boggis has flourished spectacularly since being given the chance to ride the horse 18 months ago and left newly-crowned world champion Zara Phillips among those trailing in her wake. Boggis was thrilled to taste victory, and gave much of the credit to her mount. "It was a really good win," said Boggis. "The horse went very well. He has been building up for a big win for a long time. "He deserved it. He is a very consistent horse and he pulled it out on the day."

#### Netherlands

"Mr Stan Dobrotvorski, multiple national MP Champion of the former Soviet Union, has joined the Dutch Pentathlon Association as lead trainer of the Olympic training pool. Ambitious targets have been set and we look forward to growing the number and quality of our athletes."
